AIM

To receive City Council direction concerning the results of the public feedback undertaken for the North Woodstock Recreation Facility Study.

BACKGROUND

At the November 7, 2024, meeting, staff and the project consultants provided an update to Council on the North Woodstock Recreation Facility Study. The proposed community centre is one of the recommendations coming out of the 2021 Recreation Facility Needs Study and is intended to meet the growing demand for indoor recreational facilities in our community.

The 2024 study recommends a twin pad arena, indoor pool, gymnasium and two community rooms with an estimated cost of \$85.4 million. The optional components that this study also evaluated is a curling facility and additional childcare space, with an estimated additional cost of \$15.6 million.

At the November 7, 2024, meeting, Council directed staff to obtain public feedback on the proposed facility to help inform the next stages of planning.

COMMENTS

As part of the development of the Recreation Facility Needs Assessment Study and the North Woodstock Recreation Facility Study, engagement with user groups, staff and members of Council was conducted to understand the types of amenities to be included in the facility.

To build on that earlier engagement, staff designed an engagement process, guided by International Association of Public Participation (IAP2) best practices, to:

- Share information about the project to ensure all those interested in the project have the same / up-to-date information.
- Provide a form for public comment with costs of amenities clearly outlined
- Get feedback on the community centre itself and the proposed amenities to be included.
- Get input from the public and user groups on the phasing of the implementation.

A survey was open to the public to provide input between February 10 and March 7, 2025. The survey was promoted through posters in City facilities, What's on Woodstock, local



media articles, the Recreation and Leisure Fair and social media. We received 1,697 responses. The results of the survey can be found in the attached presentation.

The project is identified in the 2029 Capital Budget Forecast, with \$85 million to come from debenture (long term debt). Through the annual budget process, Council can choose to consider alternative timing or funding.

This builds on previous engagement undertaken through Recreation Facilities Needs Assessment Study and supplementary studies


The survey:

- Was guided by International Association of Public Participation (IAP2) best practices
- Open from Feb. 10 March 7
- Total responses: 1,697
- Advertised through posters in City facilities, What's on Woodstock, news articles, postcards at Rec and Leisure Fair and social media


Notes

- Staff analyzed submissions for duplicates identified approximately 20 30 duplicates or potential duplicates
- Based on responses, 86% submissions indicated they live in Woodstock.
- There were 279 invalid postal codes submitted. Of the 1,418 postal codes mapped on slides 18 & 19, staff confirmed that 95% were Woodstock postal codes.
- There are a few postal codes that do overlap with our borders.
- When comparing the population distribution against the respondents' distribution, there was generally a correlation between the number of responses and the areas of the city with greater population density

- **Specific Facilities and Amenities** specifically mention quality of the diamonds, ice surface at Civic, indoor and outdoor soccer and splashpads


Q4. What do you not like about our current facilities?

- Lack of availability specifically ice time and swimming lessons, comments that boy's hockey takes priority over girl's hockey and other ice sports
- Aging, outdated facilities old, not keeping up with current standards
- Lack of amenities want amenities not offered including outdoor pool, warm therapy pool, more pickleball courts
- Accessibility poorly laid out facilities, stairs, narrow hallways, lack of family changerooms
- Parking and Location parking issues at Southside Aquatic Centre, easier access to other rec facilities (difficulties due to limited budgets or lack of Sunday transit)
- Recreation Program Availability capacity issues and lack of variety outside of traditional sports
- **Condition and Maintenance** specifically Civic Arena and changerooms at all facilities

Other comments:

- complaints about paying for use of indoor walking track
- limited and inconvenient seating for spectators
- desire for curling to be included,
- desire for safe places and programs for youth


Q5. What types of features or amenities are important to provide a positive experience in our recreational facilities?



Q5. What features or amenities are important to provide a positive experience – Other responses:

- Accessibility & Inclusivity Affordable pricing/free programs, accessible facilities for people with disabilities, accessible parking
- Variety of Facilities & Programs Multi-purpose sports areas (basketball, soccer, swimming pool, fitness rooms), Community gathering spaces (lounges, meeting rooms, outdoor spaces), Classes & activities for all ages and interests
- Safety & Cleanliness Well-maintained, clean and safe spaces
- **Specific Facility Features and Needs** Additional ice pads, swimming pools, walking tracks, food and beverage (healthy options and support socialization), Childcare options and family-friendly facilities
- User Comfort & Convenience Warm viewing areas, comfortable seating, clean facilities
- Efficiency and Adaptability Multi-use spaces for different sports and community events, flexible spaces to accommodate changing needs
- **Community Engagement** partner with local businesses, non-profit organizations, community hub / space, volunteering and youth leadership programs



Q6. Are there activities you would like to participate in that aren't currently available in Woodstock? If answered yes:

- 1. Expand Recreational Facilities desire for diverse sports facilities including lacrosse, cycling tracks, and squash/racquetball, additional facilities for less common sports (e.g., trampoline parks, climbing walls), improved and new curling facilities
- 2. Aquatic recreation demand for outdoor and indoor swimming pools and water parks, interest in aquatic fitness and competitive swim program
- 3. Variety of fitness opportunities that are also inclusive and accessible accessibility-focused designs for seniors and individuals with disabilities, low-cost/free options for fitness and exercise, variety of classes including Pilates, yoga, Zumba, and fitness for different age groups
- **4. Less common sport opportunities and leagues –** would like organized / community leagues and teams (e.g., volleyball, youth soccer, and basketball), badminton, pickleball, and boxing and family-focused programming
- **5. Community and cultural opportunities -** calls for classes and workshops (e.g., cooking, arts and crafts), interest in more cultural programs and community-focused events, demand for facilities that cater to both recreational and social gatherings
- 6. Youth programs increased demand for youth engagement activities and safe social spaces, sports and leisure programs tailored for children and teens, facilities aimed at youth fitness and development
- 7. Outdoor activities and amenities Interest in outdoor sports (e.g., beach volleyball, outdoor hockey rinks), need for benches, shaded areas, and environment-friendly design in parks
- 8. Multipurpose and innovative facilities facilities designed to cater to multiple activities at the same time, desire for innovative, energy-efficient designs and sustainability


Q7. How soon would you like to see work begin to build this facility?

Build sooner with borrowed money



Build everything at once




Q11. Is there anything else you'd like to share with Council and staff about the new recreation facility?


- **Need for multi-purpose recreation facilities** references to facilities in other communities, able to accommodate a variety of sports

- Look at best practices again, reference successes and failures of other communities


Q12. Do you live in Woodstock





Mini golf only one place. The city just doesn't offer enough family outdoor recreation. The walking tract should be 100% free for people over 65 and disabled as walking outdoors uneven surfaces or winter is difficult. We need more pools.

Grass cutting doesn't take priority enough for soccer athletes. Southwood arena is extremely poorly designed. Ie no spectator viewing for gym club, no bowl seating on red rink, lack of proper seating on green pad, distance between boards and wall on green pad only allows for 1 way traffic for kids with hockey bags, no restaurant in arenas to attract tournaments, bottom 2 rows of seating on green pad isn't high enough to see the game. Covic.... Everything.

Green ice pad has poor seating. Hockey arena might benefit from a bar. Window seating at Cowan Park is not sufficient, always cramped for games.

Green pad and civic center ice pads not enough seating Bring back the outdoor pool

Green pad is poorly designed, especially the change rooms, civic is run down, Woodstock has amenities but they're all in different parts of the city. A one stop shop so to speak would do wonders. Build a facility that can make money even when ice isn't rented.. ie/ community gym, basketball court that you can host dodgeball leagues, floor hockey leagues. Startech in London is a great example of an all in one facility.

Green pads seating is awful. Reeves has a bad layout. Concession at Reeves is super overpriced compared to most other arenas. Sound in both the green and red pads is awful. The Civic heaters are never on (look at facilities that have a button to turn the heaters on...this way it's not on when it's men's league and no one is watching or when not in use).

Hard to book times for working people for things like pickleball. Seems like there is lots of availability during the day but not after 5pm.

Hard to find available gyms and spaces

Hard to get ice times and are expensive, lights at ball diamonds turn off before games are done leaving players to change shoes and walk to their cars in pitch black

Hard to get into swimming lessons.

Having to walk on the roadway through park with people driving fast through, the indoor pool is cold small and and the change rooms are super small and freezing, more outdoor volleyball courts

Hockey (particularly girls) is exploding in Woodstock - with the lack of ice time availability, if we cannot accommodate the interest families will take their kids to other centres to ensure they get the quality

programming their children deserve. Additionally the current rink that is mostly dedicated to girls hockey (the Civic centre) is not well laid out for supporting an audience for our games. The washrooms are not up to par, there are zero offerings in terms of snacks / drinks, the room to move between change rooms and bleachers is inefficient and quite frankly it doesn't reflect well on Woodstock when we host teams here for our games. Hockey and skating are truly Canadian activities and we in Oxford County are showing you how much we cherish these sports through the interest in hockey programming, Canskate registrations, extra development opportunities and attendance at public skating. Please show us some care back by investing in this super important past time!!!

Honestly I just hope you have the right people planning the new arena. The last one was obviously planned by a bunch of people that have never been to other arenas and that don't have kids in hockey. The new arena should have something like a bar or restaurant in it so that the city can generate income other than our high taxes.

Hours of availability, lack of space as they're over crowded

Hours of operation Does speak to community and together ness No shade at splash pads or new parks. How busy the facilities usually are. It deters me from using them

How hard it is to learn about programs, and how quickly they fill up.

How hard it is to sign up for swim lessons as they get filled fast and I am not able to be online when registration opens because I am at work.

How limited their are. Other cities have incredible indoor pools with warm water pools for elderly and the young with jets, they have slides and diving boards for older kids. We need to expand our aquatic facilities.

How old and dated the Southside pool is, the family room is not large enough and could have a larger pool with more things to do and better swim times.

How old and small the pool is and the lack of ice time at arenas. I drive in from plattsville to use services and there is limited availability.

How they get prioritized over other important things in the city.

I currently don't use any of the facilities

I do not like how shallow the shallow end is at southside. I cannot do a flip turn in that end, because I will hit my head on the ground. Not being able to do flup turn significantly slows me down in races.

I do not like Southside Aquatic centre. Swimming lessons for my child are so busy and it's always loud. It feels very outdated.

I do not like that there is no outdoor pool. Also the indoor pool is too busy and hard to book in to class times because of the population growing.

I do not want the southside wade pool to be taken away. That is a major staple all summer for my kids and countless others. There is a huge difference between a splash pad and that wading pool/splash zone.

I don't like how far they are away from my home

I don't like our pools change rooms.

I don't like that the complex does not have a walking track. I don't like the limited amount of ice time in Woodstock. Woodstock teams should not have to rely on arenas outside of the city limits to find ice time. It is better to serve your community or they will go elsewhere. I don't like the lack of outdoor activities for young adults/teens, there should be a pump track. Walking trail should go all the way around pittock. Taxes are very high in Woodstock for what you get.

I don't like that there are so few pools with not enough parking, public skating and even paid hockey practices are often cancelled due to tournaments, that the spray and play and Lions Pool are closed/closing. We need more arenas and way more swimming facilities, better parking, and the splash pad on Van Ave really needs to be updated.

I don't like that there isn't a walking track above a hockey rink. Parents pay a lot of money to watch our kids and we should get the opportunity to be active while watching. Like the Wayne Gretzky centre.

I don't like the booking system for pickle ball courts and don't like how few outdoor ones there are. I also feel that there isn't enough awareness about the pool schedules and programs. I'd like to do some water fitness classes

I don't like the that no membership such as a YMCA that you get access to pool weight room ice for public skates

I don't know much about them as I have just moved here

I don't like alot of things: There's no fun spot to take the kids swimming indoors during winter months here. But enough ice time for playing hockey. Civic center is always freezing cold. The Southside Poole just has no fun to it in the winter. No slides nothing ...

I don't like the online sign up system.

I feel like the price is going up for all the different activities.

I feel like we could have better access to a gym that isnt privatly owened and rhat we could use another aquatic facility with a bigger sauna

I feel like we need more ball diamonds while still keeping the same standard as our other diamonds.

I feel that facilities really need more attention to detail when it comes to cleaning. Bathrooms are often on disrepair and are not always clean. I often notice outdoor garbage containers are filled to overflowing and not regularly emptied. There needs to be recycling containers at our facilities as well. I cannot believe the number of plastic recyclable containers that I see in our city garbage cans.

I feel that most of these facilities need a form of admission. In today's economy, there are hardly people who can afford it. This results in not enough people (children, youth and families) attending these places.

I hate that you have to pay to use the walking track at Cowan, and that we don't have a walking track in our arena. We don't have enough ice pads to meet the needs of all the kids who want to play hockey, and Tip O Neil ball diamond is being taken over by not a Woodstock minor ball team, taking time away from local ball teams to play on it

I really miss the outdoor pool. Our family use to use it weekly over the summer if not more.

I think it would be nice to see a social area in these facilities. Many families spend lots of time at these community facilities and it would be nice to sit and gather with other parents. I think it would be great when we get the arena that there be more than one rink. Along with an adequate area for hockey teams to warm up.

I think the city needs to really market that we are the dairy capital. I think we should have cow statues at every rec centre similar to the one in front of the hospital and it is missing a cool mural for pictures.

I think the track at Cowan should be free. There is no other indoor space that can be used to walk in the winter and the cost could prohibit some individuals especially seniors

I understand the Civic is old, but painting the inside in the Woodstock Wildcats colours would be a nice refresh while you decide what you're doing for additional rinks. It is a great old arena, but just make it a little more special for the girls.

I wish that the outdoor public pool would reopen.

I wish the concession stands were open more often and had more gluten free options

I wish the splash pad on Devonshire had more shade/trees. It also very hard to get a spot for swimming lessons. Is woodstock gymnastics run by the city? So much wasted potential with that facility, extremely limited hours is a huge barrier for us

I wish there was a place i could take my son that was indoors, and toddler friendly. There needs to be a local place we can take our Littles that is kid friendly and allows parents some freedom while the kids play. Currently, little have to be held at all times at the aquatic center. There is no where inside for toddler to explore themselves.

I wish there was another indoor walking track, feels like not enough premium (after school and weekend) time for ice.

I wish there were better skating lessons at Reeves. I take my son all the way to Brantford for skating lessons. Canskate is a waste of money in my opinion. I also don't like that there isn't a water fountain at Cowan sportsplex. If there is one, then I haven't found it yet and I take my son all the time to turf time and he's also had soccer lessons there too. I also hate the seating/viewing area for Cowan sportsplex. There's rarely any seats during indoor kids soccer so my son's grandparents had to stand to watch him.

I wish there were more locations for swimming.

I wish we had a second pool and that there was still ice available when there are girls hockey tournaments. I wish we had more than 1 swimming pool accessible, the times are lessons are crowded and I don't feel like my child gets the attention that she needs during the allotted time. More public swim times would be beneficial for my family.

I'm new here and have only used Reeves

I've noticed a lack of up keep at the complex, rest room counter falling apart, gum all over the side walks to the complex, interlocking brick going up to the complex heaving.

Ice pads are lacking compared to other cities

Ice time is getting harder to come by with the growing number of girls joining hockey. We are currently having to go out of town for practice ice and even that isn't comparable to the amount of ice available to girls hockey in other communities. Providing more rinks will help Woodstock become a more competitive hockey centre and help keep girls playing local versus going somewhere else to play more competitively.

I'd be beginner at a lot of things. I am middle aged and don't want to be made fun of by seniors when they say "you're younge" you should be able to do this. I am a person with an invisible physical disability so many things are challenging. My husband and I work weird shifts so signing up for a six week program is difficult when we can only make 2 sessions.

I'm scared to use the trails alone as a female, especially in the evenings/after dark. I live in the bird sanctuary and most of the programming is across town.

Impossible to ever book pickleball courts.

Improved pool hours. Earlier start times needed to accommodate working professionals like health care staff. Additional ice time needed for groups/clubs outside the large ones like WMHA/figure skating/wild cats etc

It would be nice not to charge for an indoor walking track, as most cities around Woodstock don't charge...we pay enough taxes and in the winter, sidewalks are icy and dangerous to walk on. We need an outdoor water park, Tillsonburg is a smaller city, and they have one. More people from Woodstock are having to go out of town to use these other facilities, because they aren't here.

It would be nice to have a walking track in the arenas. I would like to see in door walking tracks free.

It would be nice to have something available other than hockey and baseball.

It's always too crowded nowadays

It's often hard to book in to play pickleball Entry is so busy when hockey tournaments are on Too many kids running around and making messes

It's hard to book them.

Our ice availability is very limited. Green pad has terrible viewing for spectators and is very challenging to view for people in wheelchairs.

Our outdoor pool does not exist... It could have been band aided some more until a new one was built

Our pool access is too limited. It is far too busy during lessons etc and I think a second option would help. Our pool is too small and does not have a great shallow area for younger/smaller swimmers. There is also no warm/hot pool and change rooms are very drafty.

Out dated and not enough for our growing population

Out dated. Need new one badly.

Parking could be a little better at certain diamonds and parks. Otherwise my complaint is in regards to upkeep of diamonds. there are often times where leagues get shafted from there booked diamonds and pushed to alternate diamonds because the city does not want to have to rush to re line the diamonds after a tournament is done and league to start. Especially more difficult with younger children. We need more pools. Would love to see lions pool return but that seems like a long shot. Also, more activities during the week (or in general) at the sports complex. There are more sports to life than hockey and soccer.

Pool water very cold and not enjoyable for young children. The large splash pad is really nice; I don't consider the ones with one water feature a true splash pad.

POOL: The pool is old and out of date (changerooms and bathrooms are terrible, doors don't open, pooling water, not enough space). Sauna is never operational. There is no warm pool or any fun features like many other pools. Civic Arena. Great old rink...but again changerooms are literally falling apart. Bathrooms rarely work, benches falling off of the wall (yes actually fell off of the wall when girls sat on it), holes in walls, not wheelchair accessible. Complex Arena: Green pad changerooms and hall smell like chemicals (or mould) all the time. I suspect air quality is very poor. Rinks/ice time: Not enough ice available. As such, Woodstock Wildcats use ice in Thamesford and Embro. Woodstock Minor Hockey is eliminating (yes eliminating) a number of hockey teams. These kids will all move to play in other centres. Indoor Cowan- great fields. However, we must be the only municipality that charges to use a walking track? The dressing rooms don't have a decent space for stick especially with the partition wall. It's dangerous when the sticks fall (younger groups)

Reeves - terrible hvac control in dressing room area for green pad. No viewing allowed from mezzanine of green pad? All other centres allow viewing from all areas. Civic- entry/exit is in a terrible location, kids constantly need to navigate through spectators. Why can the arena not be accessed from fairgrounds side allowing a normal spectator flow and preventing congestion with the only entry point? New Devonshire ball diamonds are locked and not accessible to play on. Kids have few city wide options to play recreational baseball outside organized leagues. Overall based on the Woodstock city tax rates our local facilities fall far behind many comparative centre's which have much lower taxes and much more modern and accessible recreation facilities.

As more people get interested in these activities, it's crucial to have enough space to accommodate everyone.

Southside pool is not big enough for what the community needs. There is not enough parking. The change rooms are too small and the pool is too crowded. We need another pool badly. We could also use another ice rink.

Southside pool is outdated and not enough change rooms. Wildcats cat offer enough programs to support my daughters due to insufficient ice times.

Southside pool is outdated and very small. It's very hard to swim lanes, as there is at most only 4 lanes and due to pool size classes are filled very quickly.

Southside pool is overused. Need another pool facility for a city of this size.

-Southside pool is small and outdated. There is not enough change rooms and they become a fire hazard during busy times because so many people get stuck in a line trying to get through. -civic arena is very cold and doesn't have a snack stand. -the splash pad is extremely cold and most young kids can't stay in long.

Swim lessons fill quickly due to high demand. Pool, viewing area and change rooms are always busy. There needs to be more family change rooms available. Few non-sport recreation activities. Would love more opportunities for my children to be active in open-gym type environments. Public swim and open ice times need to be offered more frequently.

Swimming hours are not a wide variety to the public, lacks family swim time.

Dressing rooms at Reeves are downstairs - should be on a main floor or have a lower entrance for athletes if it has to be downstairs. No bar area for big sporting events like vets games, tournaments. Focus more on functionality - multiple ice pads and proper seating (like 1,000 - 1,500 seats max for bigger pads) - like Gretzky Centre, Sixteen Mile Sportsplex Oakville More gym space

That for the population, there isn't enough times / space. Specifically for lane swim, it is often over crowded since lions shut down.

That the hall rentals disappeared. As someone who needs space for corporate events for adults and kids, we are very limited, wether it be for numbers or ceiling heights.

That the pool is on the south side of the city.

That the walking track at Cowan fields cost money. Most other town/city's do not charge for its use.

That there is limited capacity for hockey teams, soccer teams, baseball facilities. Space is limited therefor unfortunately for most

That there is no door on the pool change rooms to prevent cold outside air coming into the change room. Plus the possible prevention of stopping someone from coming into the wrong change room. It would also be nice to have a bathing suit spinner in a common space to help reduce extra water not needed to be carried around within our bag.

That there is no outdoor pool, and no consideration for one. Southside pool is aging and no plans to address that either is disheartening.

That there is not a change table in the men's washrooms. Especially at civic where there is not an option for a family washroom.

That there is nothing closer to the Eastwood side of wodstock.

That there is only one pool available for all of Woodstock to use.

That there isn't enough ice time to support our current population. That our pool cannot support a swim team.

That there isn't enough ice times for our children so their team folded.

That there's only one indoor track at the far north end. The Southside pool is cold.

That they are taking away the splash pad behind the pool. That the outdoor pool is out of commission. That we need updated change rooms at Southside pool.

That they are there. We need more

That we don't have an upgraded space for the wildcats hockey team

That you need to pay to use the walking track at cowan

That you're getting rid of them

The absence of an outdoor pool and large water park . We are forced to drive to London, Kitchener and Tillsonburg for outdoor swimming.

The age of facilities ! Woodstock has not kept up

The amount of change rooms at the pool - it needs to be increased. Also I don't like that I have to pay for an indoor walking track, everywhere else with one it's free. I'd rather stay home.

The amount of time it takes for things to be repaired/replaced if broken or not functioning.

The aquatic center is far too small. No ability to have a proper lane swim as the pool is shared with other activities. It would also be nice to have a 50 m pool allowing for a swim club and swim meets which would generate revenue in the city

The aquatic center is ok but it is in need of major updating. The dressing rooms are too small and the showers are not AI way functioning properly

The aquatic centre gets really busy and crowded during the weekend swim lessons. To the point where you can't get a change room in the family area and you have to wait, dropping wet with 2 kids who are cold and wet.

The aquatic centre is far too busy for lessons, it's over crowded and cramped- not an ideal space for any child to learn. I'm frustrated that the older splash pad is now closed and we don't have something aside from an indoor pool or splash pads that are designed more for young children. I would love to see more options for indoor play during the year- especially on the weekend, for younger children.

The aquatic centre is old.. the change rooms are too tight. The colouring on the walls looks dirty. Need a bright open concept change room. Overall the area is small.. not a lot of seating at the pool side.

The are getting old out of date.

The arenas are leaking, crumbling, and poorly designed.

The arenas are very dated, and the civic is starting to fall into disrepair. The ice surface there is starting to become dangerous with a hole in the concrete below the surface that doesn't allow the ice to form and bond properly. Southside Aquatic Centre's change rooms look and feel gross. I change my child before they come to lessons so we have to spend as little time as possible in there. The pool is packed, and sectioned off during swimming lessons which is not ideal for swimming lessons.

The arenas don't have enough availability. There isn't enough after-school ice time available for teaching hockey skills (where kids are allowed on the ice with hockey equipment). Also, hockey, skating lessons and public skates are canceled far too often to accommodate tournaments. Availability of swimming lessons is not good because we haven't enough swimming pools. When I was a kid, the city was 30% smaller and had two two indoor pools and one outdoor. Now we're down to just one pool total. That isn't enough, and we're going to have a lot of kids growing to who cannot swim, and can't keep themselves safe at a lake or beach.

The Civic arena is old and crammed. The gymnastics and swimming lessons are always filled up soon after registration opens. I don't even bother trying to sign the kids up for gymnastics or swimming because I know the chances are slim of getting in. That said, my daughter LOVES gymnastics...and is a great swimmer. I wish there was a swim team locally that she could join. I grew up playing waterpolo at my local pool - would be so great to have a greater breadth of sports. I also played competitive tennis - would be great to have better tennis facilities/training in Woodstock. I know a lot of the clubs around have wait lists - I bet there would be interest for an indoor/outdoor club in Woodstock. It would be great of Woodstock could leverage its population growth to have more recreation options for kids and adults.

The civic arena needs a huge Reno, or the new facility need to have 2 ice pads to accommodate the growing population.

The civic arena needs updates or we need a new arena. The girls hockey teams use it constantly, and it's an embarrassment. The heaters don't work, the change rooms are freezing. We are a huge hockey community and the civic isn't cutting it.

The civic arena set up, but also lack of ice available to all between all arenas

The civic can not sustain the amount of traffic that goes through there

The Civic center needs to be torn down. The rooms, the seating, and the ice are all terrible.

The civic centre arena is old and lacks the amenities provided at Reeves. Having a daughter in the Wildcats hockey program means we are at civic multiple times a week. Having a new arena would provide the girls in our city with the same experience and amenities the boys have.

The Civic Centre arena is very small. We do not have enough ice pads to support the population growth and the growth of girls hockey in particular. There are also not enough indoor facilities for sports that are not hockey or turf related sports (volleyball, basketball, dodgeball, etc), having to use local school gyms. The one pool we have is also not big enough to support our growing population.

The Civic Centre arena receives a poor rating from me. Run down, small, dirty, poorly designed building. Embarassing as the host team for Wildcat games.

The civic centre arena, is a great location but needs to be updated. It's old and rundown

The civic centre has no room at all, only 4 dressing rooms no wheelchair ramp. The building is falling apart. We only have one pool in the city when we used to have 3.

The civic centre has small dressing rooms and is not ideal for spectators. Parking is limited now at Complex during hockey season. Along with baseball diamonds at complex/southside.

The civic centre is embarrassing

The civic centre is portrayed and needs a large overall to support our growing girls hockey league. We do not have enough indoor pools to accommodate our growing community.

The Civic centre is significantly outdated and is the worst arena I have been in regarding space and simply walking by others from the stands to entry/exiting doors. Whenever there are a handful of games in a row, there are 6 teams in the facility at one time (2 teams just played, 2 teams beginning a game, next 2 teams arriving in the facility). Simply using the facility for its dedicated intention and bringing other organizations in is almost embarrassing when people cant even walk beside each other to get to the stands. There is not option for standing room even to be out of the way of the traffic. This issue in its own laments the need for either a significant renovation and or a new facility with proper updates facilitating more space. As the Wildcats Organization continues to grow at an accellerated rate, the new for more ice pads is more relevant than ever. If a facility is being considered with a new ice pad, it would be more than a disappointment if a twin pad is not only considered but presented as one of the highest priorities to be considered.

The civic does not have enough change rooms, seems to be laid out backwards as far as parking and access, the walkway is far to narrow to navigate oncoming people while carrying anything

The civic has no space to move—- teams waiting to go on the ice take up all the space so people coming in can't get the seats or dressing room—- need a bigger arena

The civic. It's pathetic. Embarrassment to the city

The civic's ice is great, but the facility is extremely small and tough for people to navigate through with spectators and players with bags because of how narrow the walking lanes are around the rink. The main entrance isn't used at all because of the location. Because of ice restrictions and availability the association has to look for ice in Ingersoll & Thamesford.

The common ones are far from bus stops. From the outside, it is not recognizable as a recreational facility unless there are high visible signs (i.e. Cowan). It (recreational facilities) also lack social media presence (i.e. "marketing" videos to engage and invite Woodstock folks and neighboring counties).

The community really should have an area for squash. There was a thriving squash community that was privately run but Covid put the gym out of business. Every city centre we compete with offers squash. Ingersoll, Brantford, Stratford, London, Kitchener. More basketball options as Oxford attack leagues/teams are growing. The pickelball courts on Parkrow Could be rearranged to fit twice as many courts. This would not cost much, just requires better layout of the courts.

The condition of our facilities always kept clean and easily accessible. Staff are very pleasant and most accommodating.

The cost of using the pool. Not enough lanes for swimming

The cost to tax payers. At this point I am quite frustrated with the decisions to beautify downtown. with inflation, land tax increases coupled with the current cost of living the expectation on us tax payers isn't realistic.

The current facilities, such as our indoor southside, swimming pool needs significant renovation and rejuvenation, and a review of accessibility. Our outdoor facilities of ball diamond soccer fields are incredible and seem to have taken priority.

The diamonds at the complex are not well taken care of and were fairly dangerous this past summer. We do not currently have enough ice time available to facilitate minor hockey and adult hockey with our growing population.

The distance you need to travel to each one. We also are in desperate need of another hockey rink!

The dressing rooms for the Reeves center are down a long set of stairs and many kids can't carry their bag down those stairs. The girls are mainly scheduled at the civic center which feels like we don't think they deserve to play at the "nice" arena. All practices should be at civic and games should be scheduled for Reeves. For both genders. Civic has not been updated since I was a child in the 80s doing figure skating there. It ia cold and dreary. And the plastic curtain at the entrance needs to go. It's gross.

The extreme lack of municipal gymnasiums for basketball, volleyball and other court sports. Lack of ice availability to run sufficient hockey programs for both males and females. In need of another full sized baseball diamond for teens/adults. Tip is great but need another.

The facilities are not well maintained. We need more ice pads and we need them year round without a two week shut down.

The facilities should be combined for easier access, the walking track is so far away from the pool.

The fact that the girls hockey gets the old broken arena that is mouldy. We need a new one. That is equally shared. We don't have enough room at our aquatic centre to facilitate our population. A fight to sign up for lessons.

The fact that they charge so much for rental of the concession facilities

The fact we have no outdoor pool for families. Size of this city and the money we pay in taxes it's a huge disappointment

The floor, times and rules about who can play pickleball at cowan are no good so i go elsewhere

The green pad at the complex does not have a good viewing area and it has too much wasted space. The Civic is old and not very appealing.

The hockey arenas (which I use the most) are outdated and poorly designed. Going down stairs to get to dressing rooms is a terrible design especially for kids with hockey bags. The complex design is awful, Olympic ice is brutal and unnecessary especially for kids, seating is way too large on the red pad and creates zero atmosphere. They could have made the two ice surfaces standard size, put bowl seating in with a walking track on the main side and elevated seating on the other and saved thousands in energy bills. The green pad is worse with no space for spectators and terrible sight lines. The mezzanine area is completely useless and no warm area for observation for the red pad for seniors and small children. They could have also made the

mezzanine bigger and had a small bar or restaurant. The civic centre should have been bulldozed 25 years ago and they built it facing the wrong direction. No one even uses the front entrance.

The horse race track could be better used as a major entertainment facilities like the kitchener auditorium. Plan for a future where woodstock is double the population it is now

The hours at Cowan aren't the best and there isn't a ton of children's programming.

The hours it is open needs to be longer.

The hours need to be improved

The indoor swimming pool at south side aquatics gets very busy between 6 to 7:30am and not enough space to swim.

The lack of a proper swimming pool facility and availability of ice time etc.

The lack of availability to the ball diamonds because they are locked up and not be able to use.

The limited availability of ice time, public swims, variety of sports

The limited availability of times offered

The limited pool options

The needs to be more arena ice time a

The new ones and everything new is going north. With only 2 roads across Pittock it makes it difficult to get out there without driving through town.

The old pool is outdated and the building is gross. I wish there were more swimming facilities in Woodstock outdoor and indoor options.

The older facilities are dated. Often having to be closed for issues. Not enough ice surfaces for the community. Not centrally located (at either ends of the city).

The Olympic size ice at the complex. The management at the complex. The design of the complex itself doesn't hit many marks. The flow of people in and out of the building is bad. The atmosphere during games is weak because of the size of the red pad. Upper stands rarely used. Just a poor design overall. The windows to view the gym club are poor with many sight lines blocked.

The only pool gets full fast and lessons are incredibly hard to get into, there's never enough parking and it's the only one in town now.

The outdoor facilities are lacking after loosing the water park and outdoor pool. Would be nice to swim at the lake one day.

The parking

The pool at the aquatic centre is so cold that my baby would be shivering and blue to the point that we no longer enroll our kids there for swimming lessons. You need more splash pads, the one on Vansittart is small and parking in that area is challenging. Parks also need a shade area for young kids. And changing areas/bathrooms near the outdoor splash pads would be really helpful. Porta potties or bathroom areas near burgess trail park is needed.

The pool can't hold swim races, it's small and boring!!!

The pool change rooms are not big enough, the pool is crowded, there is not a proper track at cowan fields if you are a runner it is just not big enough and the curves are not standard.

The pool could be warmer and better ventilation

The pool is dated and needs some repair. The civic centre needs to be replaced. The splash pad should have been rebuilt - not replaced.

The pool is freezing cold water

The pool is old and the facility has not been kept up

The pool is over crowded with no part shallow enough for smaller kids

The pool is run down, showers are horrible with mould and cold showers. The sauna doesn't work properly never warm enough.

The pool is small and change space is inadequate. Civic Arena (although rarely visited), being used as a regular ice pad is embarrassing.

The pool is small and cold for little kids, change rooms are tiny, you got rid of the outdoor wade pool in favour

of a splash pad which sucks because the wading pool was super fun for kids, there's no shade at the devonshire Ave splash pad

The pool is SO busy. Also, not located in my area of town.

The pool is so small and outdated

The pool is tiny and poorly shaped. Not enough change room space for family change room

The pool is too crowded.

The pool is too small and cannot meet community needs.

The pool is too small for our population. We need another bigger pool. We need a community weight room or gym similar to the one at Tillsonburg Community Centre.

The pool isn't big enough for the amount of people we have. Sad to see the splash pad go.

The pool seems like it's getting old and a bit damaged. It is unfortunate that it is the only pool in Woodstock. The civic centre is getting old and there is not a lot of space in the halls and dressing rooms.

The public swims are so busy which discourage more frequent attendance.

The Reeves Complex has issues with the multiple levels and access. Civic Centre was never designed properly and has poor flow and layout. (Was designed backwards) Southside Aquatic is a nice facility but is old and need a thorough renovation.

The Reeves complex should have adequate seating on the green pad. There is often hockey games going on and accessibility is atrocious for viewing a hockey game. I assume the green pad was built for practice only or figure skating but anytime after 6 PM. There are hockey games going on at both arenas and there needs to be adequate seating for viewing. Very unusual to upstairs going down to the dressing rooms. Often Arena's use long ramps. Not enough lobby space at the reeves arena.

The seating area for fans during home games

The shuttering of Lion's Pool /lack of outdoor central swim facility

The size of the red ice pad is too big it needs to be NHL size max. The Civic Centre is embarrassing and needs to be burned to the ground. The seating in the green pad is a joke. The washrooms are disgusting in the arenas.

The smoking at the ball diamonds and butts left in and around benches. Pool is old and tired.

The soccer fields are in terrible shape. And there isn't enough ice pads available in the city

The soccer fields are not properly maintained Not enough ice pads Terrible seating on the green pad at reeves and in the flip side the red pad has an excessive amount of seats of which the upper section never gets used Neither facility can properly host tournaments Cowan park is not well enough maintained to host tournaments for outdoor soccer and the indoor soccer is terrible for both viewing and field size for playing indoor.

The South Side Aquatic center needs suit spinner to dry suits and more time for family or fun swim in the evening during the week.

The southside aquatic center is far to small for how much the city has grown. The number of classes being offered at one time in the pool on any given night is VERY chaotic and loud. For new swimmers it is extremely intimidating and overwhelming. Lessons can be hard to get signed up for if you are not able to log in right on the day registration opens.

The splash pad was not ideal for a working family the hours were not ideal. The outdoor splash pads that we do have at Devonshire and vansitart are great! I think that just incorporating MORE of what we do have would be great!

the staff are friendly and helpful

THE STAIRS AT THE COMPLEX!!! Stairs with a giant hockey bag???? I am too old for that now and it scared me as a kid when I had to carry my bag down.

The swimming pool is cold so perhaps increase the water temp so it more bareable for kids swim lessons The temperature of water at Southside Pool, not little kid friendly.

The tight space to move around rinks to get to dressing rooms, congested at times when traffic is higher due to games ending and people getting out of the arenas

The trails are very poorly/rarely maintained.

The tread pad at reeves seasting you can't see the use. Also we need more ice pads in woodstocks. The girls are always at civic arena

The walking track hours do not accommodate people who like to exercise before work in the morning. With the amount of money we pay, we should be given access to use the walking track before 8:45. Staff at this facility get very lax about supervising the walking track to prevent non paying soccer league spectators from disrupting the paid users.

The walking track is to expensive to use on a regular basis. Unfortunately this is not affordable for your average class working family due to the costs.

The walls at the sportslex is silly, can't see half the field with large beams in the way and not allowed to watch from above track. No close shade at the splash pad on Devonshire, civic arena needs a big upgrade, looks old

The washrooms in the red pad at the Reeves Centre look gross, unwelcoming and are very cold. The water refill stations need to be replaced. It would be nice to have an outdoor pool like Stratford or Paris have. Those are both very lovely concepts.

The website for Cowan Park (pickleball) was not user friendly. There is NO "drop-in" pickleball and yet those words were very visible on the website. The need to book 3 - 4 days in advance of when you want to play makes it impossible for me (and others have agreed with me on this) to use the facility. The change rooms were terrible at the Southside Pool the last time I was there. (Since being there I did learn that renovation work is scheduled so the terrible condition is understandable.) The bike lane lines painted on the streets was a failed project in my opinion. (I am an avid adult biker.). The Reeves hockey arena has two broken water stations apparently. Can a school program be developed to provide swimming lessons and life-saving rescue lessons (free?) to all the applicable local schools? (My childhood swimming lessons and boat safety lessons that I took as a child have helped me save numerous at least 8) lives...including my own!!!).

The Woodstock wildcats need a new home ice surface for games and tournaments. Two ice pads are needed to facilitate the growing demand of girls hockey in Woodstock.

Their age and not being able to provide accessibility and functionality to the public.

There are ample arenas, however not enough pools in this city. The sport of swimming is undervalued given Woodstocks response to resurfacing and/or adding another pool to this community. We don't need more ball diamonds, or soccer fields, or arenas. ANOTHER POOL IS NEEDED! Residents are accessing swimming in neighbouring communities because Woodstock is profoundly lacking in this regard.

There are currently no outdoor pools in Woodstock. There needs to be enough offerings to support the massive population growth.

There are no snacks at Cowan Soccer. No vending machines or anything for the athletes

There are not enough ice pads for all the players to use and having to leave the community to practice on other ice pads

There are not enough ice rinks and I don't like that some ball diamonds are closed off to the public.

There are not enough ice time available for our growing community. Because we do not have enough ice available some devisions can no longer play.

There are not enough ice time available on our current rinks to meet demand.

There are not enough of them to support how quickly Woodstock has grown.

There are not enough of them.

There are not enough outdoor pickleball courts (eg Goderich has great outdoor drop in facilities)

There are not enough pools. Getting swimming lessons and lane swims at convenient times is hard. There is also not enough field time for indoor soccer.

There are not enough weekday public swims in the summer time. We leave woodstock to goto other nearby cities which have weekday swims. I don't feel comfortable using the trail systems to walk alone anymore. Since encampments and crime have been happening in the trails. In the mornings in the winter there is no time to rent a pickleball court. In the summer there are not enough outdoor courts.

There aren't enough to go around. More and more sports group want more time and there just aren't enough resources for the current demand.

There doesn't seem to be enough available ice times in Woodstock to accommodate all of the hockey teams.

There is a lack of all recreation facilities in Woodstock. We know the link between physical activity and mental health. Please start building and getting all ages up and moving.

There is a lack of ice time in Woodstock with the current 3 ice pads. It appears boys and girls (especially girls hockey) appears to have grown drastically so it is almost impossible to get ice team at a decent time. The area/stairs at the Reeves Complex and the area/space at the Civic Arena are not great. It makes it tough for players to access dressing rooms easily and spectators to move around and watch their families' games. The Complex has lots of wasted space in the entrance/lobby and limited seats on the Green Pad. The elevator and ramps are not very convent or accessible for people with disables. The Civic has a decent amount of seats but everything is so narrow it's tough to move around without being in every one's personal space. Also, near impossible for someone in a wheelchair to move around without just sitting just inside the entrance.

There is extremely limited space in the aquatic centre. I'm particular, the family change rooms are VERY small and the layout makes it challenging to navigate the room when waiting for a change room to open up

There is goose poop all over the splash pads. The trails are not very accessible, many are difficult to get to because of slope and trenches in the paths. The pool is overcrowded during public swim and lessons are difficult with children failing again and again because they are too distracted to swim and listen. The Cowan sports complex was great for young kids but the cityvcharges too much to use the walking path. We enjoyed soccer and gymnastics as well as swimming lessons, public skating and swimming but there is never enough space to get in when you try to sign up, you have to be ready first thing in the day or you risk no spot and public free/day use is too crowded. The bathrooms in the Reeves Complex are filthy. There is too much poison ivy at Cowan Fields.

There is inadequate ice time for the needs of children in the city. Girls associations compete for ice time with other associations and in the end, someone is missing out on opportunities to be active. Civic centre arena is extremely old and I am concerned that it will stop being functional before a new arena is built which will further the ice time issue. Southside Aquatic centre is also extremely inadequate. It is not large enough to allow for competitive swimming in the city of Woodstock and residents have to travel to Wilmot to race.

There is insufficient indoor aquatic space and aquatic fitness opportunities.

There is little availability for ice time and swimming lesson registration fills up so quickly. It would be good to have more nights of the week for soccer.

There is never enough ice time.

There is no restaurant or bar at the complex and a walking track would be nice at an arena facility

There is no walking track, there is not enough ice time for girls and boys hockey, we need a facility that encompasses a couple ice pads, sport courts, walking track, gym, pool - it is embarrassing that we travel other communities that are smaller and they have all in one facilities and we host them in the Civic center.

There is not a no charge for a walking track for seniors to use and no warm water pool for seniors.

There is not enough ice rinks to facilitate the demands

There is not enough ice time available for youth sports

There is not enough ice time or swimming availability to provide then necessary services to the community and youth especially. We need another 2 areas and a large scale pool that is heated. We need a childcare space more than ever and putting one in the administration office area of the building in some way is urgently needed. Southside pool is soo cold and the changes are way too small. There is not enough room for children to learn how to properly swim or to even get lessons. You have a better chance at winning the lottery.

There is not enough ice time to sustain the growing population of minor hockey and figure skating clubs.

There is not enough of them

There is not enough of them in our city

There is not enough of them! Limited times for activities

There is not enough of them. Also the Sutherland ball diamond gets less attention than other diamonds. That should change.

There is not enough park space, Southside park expansion needs to be a priority!

There is only one indoor swimming pool that is available to use. As such it is always busy. More options would be nice.

There is something about the concept of the YMCA that is great for a community: having an all around Centre (one stop shop) basketball gym, library, rink, fitness centre with affordable memberships.

There isn't enough availability for the growing demand in Woodstock. Swimming lessons fill up too quickly and the change rooms are so full. Woodstock definitely needs another swimming pool, rec center, gym etc.

There isn't enough ice time available with only three ice pads available in Woodstock for the growing population and people playing hockey of all ages. Continuation of sport throughout life and maintaining an active lifestyle for kids, teens and adults is important for a healthy society. It is also very important for mental health. We need at least an additional two ice pads at the proposed facility because currently there is not enough ice time available on evenings and weekends that teams are being sent out of town for practices.

There isn't anything I dislike about our current facilities.

There isn't enough availability. Seating is terrible for basketball at Cowan Park

There isn't enough ice pads, nor time slots

there just isn't enough for the growth/growing of our city. Can't get into lessons for swimming, gymnastics, ice time.....

There needs to be another rink so we can be a AAA center, more activities like ball hockey baseball, basketball etc.

There not enough. One swimming pool for a population this size is RIDICULOUS

There's isn't enough , need better pool

There's not enough space to accommodate everyone at the facilities, there isn't a time for just a casual/relaxing swim for those that don't want to do lane or aqua fit. There should be a skating pad that offers more time for adults in the evening to offer those that work during the day can enjoy an evening skate to help encourage staying active.

They are all okay

They are all outdated. The showers don't work in the pool. The pool is too small for the population of Woodstock.

They are becoming outdated esp. SAC. We greatly lack sufficient indoor athletic space for our young families. They are busy (well-used) and it feels like we need more as the population grows.

They are dated and always too busy

They are dated, overbooked.

They are dated.

They are extremely overcrowded, way too many people, especially at Southside pool.

They are getting old. We need a new one location committee centre. We also need a indoor practice area for ball

They are not big enough for the public. It is always cramped because there is only one big splash pad or indoor pool.

Swimming facility is very outdated. Does not offer tournament standards. Only one aquatic facility for a city of this size is pathetic. Getting into the lessons that work best for our family is extremely difficult. Our change rooms are a headache to deal with.

They are old

They are old, out dated and not enough ice time. There is no walking track or gym to work out. Some have libraries and it's an experience to visit.

They are older and run down needing a lot of repairs. There's not enough seating space or change room space

at Southside for swimming lessons with all the lessons that go on at once, and proper field sizing (indoor and outdoor) for soccer to go with the divisions offered. There's also not enough indoor turf space to accommodate the needs of indoor house league AND our competitive teams

They are pretty old. Maintaining them should be more often so when things are fixed or updated the cost is spread out rather than a huge amount all at once

Also we need a city operated curling facility that is affordable for all. The private club is great but not financially affordable for families. Curling is a very fast growing sport in popularity in Canada. Woodstock should be tapping into this interest.

1. I think it's important to realize communities similar in size or smaller have better/bigger options than Woodstock. 2. Be sure to consult all areas of expertise prior to building a new complex. Tour other facilities to be sure what we decide on is best for the community. See Pelham, Peterborough, etc.

2 ice pads is necessary

A bigger more capable facility will bring in more revenue for local businesses. With inflation only going higher it probably makes more sense to build bigger now rather then wait 10-15 years. If building in stages makes more financial sense then i would rather do that then going too small and not being able to grow. Again I think it needs to be a one stop shop for all community needs taking from the YMCA principle providing top of the line access to everyone in woodstock in the growing community.

Although the construction should begin immediately (it is already past due), I am not a fan of the costs of borrowing. Our property taxes are already very high. Has the city explored other options like private company sponsorship?

Although there will be a substantial upfront cost, I believe that it's better to build something high end that will stand the test of time then to build something that doesn't quite meet all the city's needs to try and save \$.

An amazing complex with multiple sports will draw tournaments into the community more often improving our overall economic state. With a hotel under construction in this same area this positively impacts this ability even further

An indoor walking track We do not need a cricket field!

An indoor/ outdoor pool is a must for Woodstock. We have nothing. It's desperately needed for the size of our city.

An outdoor artificial turf field would be beneficial for football and soccer

An outdoor track would be nice

Another complex isn't needed unless there is ALSO a pool included in that. We don't need multiples of the same, but there is only 1 pool to serve the entire community, and that isn't fair to the taxpayers.

As I have been at a lot of arenas in Ontario due to travel hockey with both my son and daughter, the one thing I have liked having in arenas is a restaurant. Something like the arena in Brantford or St Catherine's would be perfect. Obviously does not need to a four pad arena just using examples.

As I live in the heavily residential neighbourhood adjacent to the location of the proposed new recreation facility, I do have concerns over increased traffic (vehicle and pedestrian) and hope that appropriate measures are taken to try and preserve the quiet residential atmosphere that North East residents so greatly value by allowing for multiple access points off of larger, less residential roadways like Devonshire and Township Road 3 vs. Springbank Avenue.

As someone who has lived in Woodstock my whole life I feel there is a lack of programs for young teens such as youth groups in the city that emphasize sports, board games and socializing to meet and interact with others your age. It is a feeling I have that those that sit on the city council are out of touch with the youth of today and have been for a while. I am 30 and many of my friends and former classmates that had grown up in Woodstock share the same feeling. There seems to be a focus on children under the age of 12 but there is no focus on teenagers 12+ when they are the most impressionable and tend to begin to make poor decisions. There used to be 2 major youth groups in town, Cornerstone Baptist Church and River of Life both downtown. Now I no longer hear about neither. There used to be a Friday night Flic n Float swimming and film at the YMCA that no longer exists. It should be in the councils priority that the new facilities have the capacity to provide these programs and to market it as budget friendly. Even if it is free for those between 12-17 I am sure the city can find it in their budget to provide it. As someone that is at the age of starting a family I am considering moving away from Woodstock to communities that have better programs.

Ask for feedback on design for each feature. Its important to get community feedback.

At least two ice pads with proper heated viewing areas that isn't just a 2 tier bleacher. A small area for children to play while spending many hours at rec facilities while siblings play. Viewing areas where you sit above the

height of the boards (as seen in other new arenas) making it easier to watch. Suitable parking for when tournaments are going on. Larger "warm room" viewing areas.

Bad location. Move things to the other side of the city

Having answered # 10 about functionality and community needs, I think we do need a facility that can host tournaments (hockey/skating tourneys/competitions, basketball tourneys). Our community is growing and hosting these events brings a lot of money and people to our community which is important. Reeves was built at a time when figure skating was more popular but the red pad seating is too spread out and I've rarely seen it close to full ever (in my figure skating or watching boys playing hockey)- seats need to be more intimate to ice, smaller amount of seating, closer to ice More pickleball court space - lots of difficulty finding places/ reserving times to play locally.

Help with funds to support build . le vendors , tournaments etc

Hockey is Woodstocks heartbeat! Lets get investment coming in by building this into a formidable hockey city! Hockey programs have been eliminated in Woodstock for B teams due to a lack of available ice. As a result, families are traveling to play out of neighboring centers vs playing locally. I am unclear on the need for another gymnasium or multi-purpose rooms as there are available facilities and to my knowledge, existing facilities are not at capacity.

Honestly I'm not sure this is the right field for this, but this survey is.... Really bad. It jumps straight from asking vague general questions about amenities in the city into asking about how soon I'd like to "build this facility," without any context or information about the facility in question. What facility? What's the budget? What are the impacts of these decisions on taxpayers? These survey questions don't seem to be designed to illicit any kind of usable information, as they lack context. Fortunately I know what the scope of the project is, but many/most other respondents might not have any information upon which to provide reasonable responses.

I believe it would be nice to be able to include a full sized indoor soccer pitch for the community. Not only for the soccer club but for the local highschools. Great income investment as well.

I believe partnering with other organizations is important to make this both a viable and economical venture. Consider organizations such as curling center, sports associations, community health organizations, youth centers etc - think outside of the box as to how to utilize the spaces to capacity

I believe that every child should be able to take swimming lessons or go to a pool with their friends similar to what my generation was able to do growing up in this city.

I commend the Woodstock Council for being proactive and looking for feedback from citizens and community members. We currently live in Ingersoll and have children who play sports in Woodstock because these youth sports are run by great organizations. We are considering moving to Woodstock due to Sports & Recs activities available but its not in the cards for a few years due to the current housing market.

I do not live in Woodstock. I have a Thamesford address. But I work in Woodstock, and my kids play sports in Woodstock (Navy Vets, Volleyball, Wildcats) and my kids go to school in Woodstock (WCI and HOLY FAMILY)

I don't believe that the new arena should cause the civic to be shutdown having three arenas is ideal with the amount of men's hockey and youth house league hockey that uses the civic it should be kept in service.

I don't have enough information to answer number 10. How much more would it cost to build a top end facility? If it is reasonable to put a little more in to do this- sure. But if it skyrockets the price- than No.

I feel like the city would have the money for the facility if they scrapped the Dundas Street project. Everyone I've talked to doesn't want it done and sees it as a big waste of money.

I feel that having services for people to stay active at all ages is important. Ice skating for youth, curling for middle aged and older adults/ seniors, and a multipurpose room used for all.

I feel that if we keep "waiting to build until we have the funds", it will never happen. Oxford County keeps growing, the needs increase with limited access when things need to shut down for maintenance or close due to high cost repair. If we build it, the fees can help, organizations can rent it, use it, and will attract other events because the size of the space is available to book. We can keep events local and use all facilities in big tournaments.

I have attended information sessions, recreation planning meetings, completed surveys, and given the same answers which have come directly from other City of Woodstock residents. This seems like an awful lot of information gathering to continually hear the same result - the City is in dire need of additional ice pads to meet the current needs of youth and adult programming. By avoiding this project, you are limiting the growth of minor hockey, which is now more competitive than ever due to open borders, and lack of available ice severely inhibits the organization's ability to be competitive in this area. Girls hockey is rapidly growing and lack of ice negatively impacts their ability to grow as an organization as well. And the lack of prime time ice for Adult programming limits the number of leagues available for people who desperately need more options. Avoiding this will only further push Woodstock into being a non-desirable place for people to register their kids in youth sports, and negatively impact the overall health of the adult population. Stop delaying, make a positive impact during your term on Council, and get this moving forward ASAP.

I have been in Woodstock for 10 years now, and have participated in activities at our facilities as well as having my children in various activities at the facilities as well. As soon as we moved here, we heard talk of a new facility. Ten years later, still nothing.

I have heard there is a proposal to table the rec facility for five years and put money into the Civic to allow us to get by for some time. That seems counterproductive to me - for one the Civic Centre would be out of

commission while being upgraded which depletes already extremely low ice availability AND putting money into a building that cannot be made more functional due to layout limitations seems like a waste of money and time. Please continue with the planned timeline for the rec facility - we desperately need it!!

I have travelled all over Southwestern Ontario (from Windsor to Oshawa) and even as far as Quebec for hockey and baseball with my son. The facilities Woodstock offers for the hockey community are absolutely pathetic compared to some other facilities I've been to. Woodstock is relatively central to all major hockey communities and with a similar population, there is no excuse as to why we shouldn't be able to give the same recognition and hype to the sport the same way we do with baseball & and 13U Nationals Baseball tournament. Having a multi-sport facility with extra ice surfaces, an indoor swimming pool and basketball/pickleball courts is what our community needs NOW - not years from now.

I hope the project starts asap & that it will make a positive difference

I hope you start it ASAP. Very excited to see it come to life.

I know people want bigger and better things: more pools, more rinks, more courts. But it would also be nice to have more things in our immediate neighbourhoods, like little parkettes with swing sets and splash pads, fitness facilities that are affordable and support the community

I know that some ice by woodstock minor hockey is subsidized, they have \$600,000 in minor hockey bank account. Maybe some of that should go towards a new facility as it is mostly tax dollars anyway.

I like the idea of Building top end facility because it brings out of town teams to stay and spend money within our community. Specifically Cowan Feilds being so close to 401/403 it would be a missed opportunity to generate future income within community

I live in Innerkip and we use Woodstock for all activities.

I run a business in town and am very active in the sporting community. The issue with saving and delaying the build out is the cost of infrastructure build ours is likely inflsting at a faster pace then the return on savings. The sooner it's built the more cost effective it will be in the long term. Not providing amenities may make residents seek other communities that do.

I think a disservice was done to our community when the outdoor pool was permanently closed. It was a wonderful amenity and needs to brought back. Learning to swim is important and with only 1 pool now available there are to few options for swimming and for swimming lessons.

-I think adding a childcare space is essential. -I think a twin ice pad is vital due to demand and a growing community. Currently Woodstock wildcats in unable to offer girls under 8 enough ice time to offer a division other than the kittens (can skate hockey) one hour a week. In comparison, boys in the same age division are given 3 hours of ice time a week. We are unable to book additional ice times to train teams, offer large tournaments, have birthday parties, start a ringette league or offer enough ice time to figure skaters. -An indoor is so necessary and needed. It is extremely hard to register children for swimming lessons because they sell out so fast and there is only so much room in one pool. Swimming is a life skill that every child and adult needs to learn and many parents are unable to get spots in lessons to have their kids learn. -the current pool doesn't offer long enough lengths for competitive swim training. The changerooms are gross and small and cold.

I think it is a shame that the Lions Pool was not repaired for young people in the city. This pool was used for over 80 years and most people in the city learned to swim there. The reason given was lack of funds to repair this pool. I feel very bad that children living in the older part of the city do not have a pool close to where they live. The Lions Pool should be repaired before we consider expanding the recreational facility.

I think it needs to have a pool, two ice pads, a childcare centre, a food place and more. Everyone is moving to Woodstock and demand for community amenities will only grow. Woodstock is a big sports and recreation community and these spaces are community hubs. Parents are more restricted than ever about what they can let their kids do so many people now have kids signed up in multiple sports because kids can't be left outside to play.

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I think it that area of town needs something like this. Like I said an indoor track or indoors activities for winter on this side of town would be extremely beneficial! Also the pool too would be a great addition 1000 percent! I think it would be beneficial to the children and youth within the community to have 'staff' available to them. Meaning trusted adults who they can speak to. I think that by adding a city bus stop out front would be helpful. I think that by going into schools and conducting surveys to hear what children and youth of the community have to say about a new community centre.

I think it's important to prioritize spaces for activities that kids and teens can use at low cost. Arenas for hockey are great, but the cost of hockey is a lot and therefore is not accessible to many families that could benefit from enhanced recreation opportunities. I feel like an outdoor pool is missing from the current recreation offerings; this would offer low cost recreation that is appropriate for kids and teens (vs the toddler crowd that splash pads cater to).

I think that the City needs to do a better job of planning for these depreciating assets with respect to replacement. The City is faced with a variety of facilities (eq. Lions Pool, Civic Centre) that are aging out of functional service - while these are known entities for over a decade, the City has not properly planned to execute replacement facilities, or rather they have named plans, but delayed in action. Many of the facilities discussed at the Cowan Fields location have been proposed since 2012, at a fraction of the current cost being quoted, but because of failure to execute these facilities have not been appropriately initiated. It seems that the City should develop a reserve fund to support future recreational facilities - in part, this could consist of a % age (or fixed) amount of every use of these facilities (eg. Take \$X from every rental fee, user fee, registration fee) and put it into a fund to replace recreation facilities in the future. I would like to see the City pursuing more public-private partnerships to encourage private donations, corporate sponsorships/naming rights, to offset the cost to the public taxpayer - similar to what was seen with Southgate Centre, whereby the City will commit \$x towards a project, if the remainder is raised privately. It is also likely that high-end facilities will require provincial and/or federal grants/funding opportunities. These types of facilities should be designed as an investment to attract other income sources towards the City - what types of facilities does the City require to host provincial or even national tournaments (eg. Ontario or Canada Games).

I think that the city should be looking to companies like Toyota for sponsorship. Lots of arenas in the GTA are sponsored by big company's providing them with advertising opportunities.

I think that we could really come together as a community to help crowd fund the facility. It would help residents feel like it is their facility and to take pride in it. Baseball teams, gymnastic clubs, soccer teams, etc could do fundraisers like krispy kreme, bake sales, bottle drives, etc. Local businesses, realtors, etc could donate goods/services to be auctioned off or part of a draw. The city could advertise a mass 50/50 campaign. The city could host charity baseball or soccer tournaments where local factories pay an entry fee to raise money/awareness. We can make money by hosting larger tournaments to outside sport teams. Food truck Fridays at the park May-September with funds going to the facility. Saturday outdoor movies in the park with \$5 admission and sell popcorn/ice cream.

I think the pool should be the first priority and first to be built.

I think there should be a back room with all the stuff you need for different sports eg. swimming, hockey, volleyball etc

I think this is an opportunity to show everyone how valuable the community of Woodstock is. Maybe we could tie it in with being the dairy capital with cow status ?

I think this is needed immediately and cannot wait another 4 years. Young families are flocking to Woodstock and the surrounding areas and our current recreational centres are over run during peak hours. Kids are being denied lose saving life skills like learning to swim because getting into swimming lessons is so competitive because there is not enough room. My daughters hockey league is not able to offer an u7 league or women's hockey training due to no ice time available even though the males at that age are provided it. Businesses that are very popular (figure skating or hockey training) cannot get enough hours to train or operate properly. As an adult I will not swim at Southside pool because it is gross and the change rooms are freezings and small. The pool water is not a good temperature that all the kids are shivering after. We need this to start being built next year.

I think with the growth of the city as much as it would be beneficial to try and raise/save, gather donations, I feel a newer facility should be high on the plans for expanding and growing our community.

I truly believe the Sportsplex should have some form of restaurant inside with healthy options to fuel our residents.

I want to see a functional arena with multiple seating options, a walking track, and or a bar

I want to see the money spent timely and not wait around. My hope is that all facilities are kept up to the standard they begin with and not let us get to the point we have to close a facility (lion's pool) and not have a replacement immediately ready. Soon the Civic arena will be closed , will you have a replacement ready?? Forget beautifying downtown with my money . Work on entry parts to the city...ie the west end is embarrassing.

I will be looking for a job

I work in the industry and have been part of many construction projects over the years, Cambridge Ice Park, Wellesly, Lakeshore MURF, Bostwick and have seen poor designs that contribute to expensive maintenance costs. Value engineering leaves a product that performs poorly. Rushed construction and unattainable timelines promised leave the tax payer with a poor product. Woodstock needs a high level facility that is accessible for all in the community. Instead of a gymnasium shoot for a fieldhouse that can host large tournaments and activities. Basketball, volleyball, pickleball, tournaments, Field could be subdivided into three or four courts. What happens when the Civic's machine room fails and cannot be repaired. Ice time is precious to all the crazy hockey parents. My kid will play beer league so I am realistic, ha. Anyways the parents will be relentless and viscious. It only becomes more expensive waiting to build. Construction costs are climbing as we do not have enough tradespersons to support the demand. Wait, and pay more. Build soon and deal with it. If it is built, will it be staffed adequately? Some of the design firms bidding are questionable. Lowest bid is the worst approach. Design costs should be tied to job size and proper coordination reduces change orders as job is quoted properly. It is amazing what is missed on poor design and how the change orders add up. Save the pennies and the dollars go rolling by. Great places to live include excellent rec facilties.

I would also love to see a top level facility but already fear that this project may take too long to get started or to build and I would like to be able to enjoy it with my family. The city is growing very fast as well.

I would like a new curling rink, as the old one isn't fit for purpose anymore, I'm retired and I enjoy playing, and it keeps me fit in the winter

I would like it if most of city council, fire fighters and other high ranking official would take an acceptable pay wage, not over a \$100000 a year.

I would like something for my 15 year old to do. There's lots for little kids, but teens are soo bored they just wander.

I would like the new rec complex to include indoor swimming pools and outdoor bike/skate park.

I would like to see a Curling facility added to the plans. This is a very active sport enjoyed by all ages. It's a shame the Council doesn't support this fantastic club.

I would like to see a free walking track included in the building. This track wouldn't be fancy like the other one. This is something for adults to do while they are waiting for their child when they practice. Renting out the track the other track to sports groups to use for specialized off ice, off field training could help with revenue.

I would like to see a new multi purpose curling centre as it has physical and social benefits for many age groups and abilities.

I would like to see community fund raising.

I would like to see curling facilities added The Woodstock curling centre is getting old and is not accessible I would like to see curling pads added as per the plans.

I would like to see indoor tennis courts

I would look at including a public curling club, if new ice pads are developed several curling pads could be added since the infrastructure is already there for the hockey ice - ie compressor

I would love to see the curling club move into the new facility

I would put less money into outdoor pickleball courts that can only be used 5 mths of the year and put more into an indoor facility that can be used year round. The twin pad is long over due and possible the pool and gym, I'm not familiar with there use. Are there other city buildings that have rooms not being used that could be multi-purpose rooms? A functional facility that could also be used for tournaments would be good to bring business to the city without adding high end finishing touches that are pleasing to the eye but don't add to the

function of the facility.

I would rather see money go towards a top end facility and fix Van Ave pool rather than upgrading Dundas Street. Spending millions on Dundas Street does not attract me to shop downtown. I seldom go downtown due to feeling unsafe and unwelcome by the increased homeless population. Even my bank is moving away from the downtown core.

I would really like them to focus on the aquatic aspect. There are only 2 places in Woodstock to swim, the YMCA and Southside. Most people can not afford the YMCA membership fees but Southside is too small to handle the needs of the community. Not only is the public is affected, school swim teams are being cancled or having to use only one lane for the entire team as it's hard to fit into the schedule.

I WOULD SAY BUILD ONE RINK AND THE POOL, THEN ADD THE OTHERS LATER

I would suggest fundraising to help with the cost of the build. I feel people of Woodstock would be willing to donate if the facility is done right (all at once and large to be able to host tournaments). I would donate if it meant I no longer had to leave Woodstock to take my kids to hockey.

I'd like to see an inclusive design and have community meeting space.

I'm disappointed that the city is letting the Lion's pool go and that we won't have an outdoor pool with the proposed plan. Kids love swimming outdoors in the summer. Indoor pools get hot and humid in the summer months and an outdoor pool is fun and special.

I'm for everything to give our kid s option to stay busy and have fun to keep them from going down the wrong path and ending up on the streets !!

Ice pads are long overdue.

Ice surfaces should have skate rental and skate aids

Ice time is a huge problem in Woodstock. There is just not enough ice available to support the growing needs of the city. The city needs a twin pad at the very least! A new recreation facility needed to be built like 5 years ago. The sooner this can be started, the better! Woodstock needs to just spend the money and get a new facility built.

Ice time needs to be able to be shared between all levels of hockey, and figure skating. Both provide opportunities for kids to get active which is important long-term.

I'd like to see a partnership with the City, the Curling Centre, and the provincial government as a multi-purpose facility. The facility could include childcare. In the off-season (April to Sept) the facility would be a fantastic area for summer camps.

if a high end facility is built for petes sake use it!!

If hockey pads are built, they should be utilized/available equally for girls and boys hockey. Historically, girls hockey has been primarily at the older, more run down civic while boys are primarily at the nicer complex.

If not now, when? Yes, we need to juggle the financial commitments, but delaying something like this will only continue to harm families and impact the growth and development of our youth. Families will continue to leave the community for recreational activities elsewhere...once they leave and establish meaningful relationships, it's extremely difficult for them to rejoin our community and to utilize our facilities. If you build it...

If our taxes are being raised yet again to fund this. I would rather not build it.

If possible it should include a pool, rinks and childcare centre and somewhere to get food from to be able to provide the services our growing community needs.

If we get a new arena, it should be the home to the wildcats. The Navy Vets have had the complex as their home arena and the girls have had that shitty arena we call the civic. The girls deserve to have a new arena over the bots

If we have a tournament facility, the local families would not be able to use it as much. Lake Lisgar in Tillsonburg and the Victoria Rec Centre in Ingersoll are good examples of fun, family friendly pools. Wilmot rec centre in Baden also has a great facility.

If we plan to host more tourneys then I believe our hospitality needs to be increased. I've heard from others that people will stay in Brantford or London when. Woodstock has tourneys because our hotels are not up to par. When we do host these tourneys people gravitate to patios and downtown which then makes me think I wouldn't let my kids walk around downtown on their home due to all the unwelcoming scenery down there.

You know what I mean.

If we wait, the increased cost will likely cost more than the cost to borrow money. Set a fundraising goal for residents and businesses to hit in order to break ground.

If we want to bring more tournaments to the new complex in the north end then we will need a grocery store and maybe take out restaurants in the north end!!!

If Woodstock minor hockey is to draw decent players with open borders available ice times will be considered for anyone playing at a competitive level. Woodstock does not have enough ice as of today and with less ice available for next year local talent will leave

If you build it, they will come. I know, sounds cliche...but adding more arenas, diamonds etc will allow more tournaments...more hotel reservations...more busy restaurants

If you build the multi arena facility then you can host tournaments and skating competitions using all 4 pads (reeves and the new facility). There will be added revenue to the local businesses if you are drawing people in for tournaments etc.

If you build top end, the city or local business could potentially see the extra income from it

If you want better tournaments put a bar in the arena with ice viewing. Parents drink in the stands anyways at hockey tournaments.

Impact on neighborhood have you heard their voices. Privacy fencing. How about a new council that listens to what locals want.

In floor heating in the stands

Include a curling center

Include a curling facility in the new recreational facility. This could be a multi purpose building with cement floors and be used for pickle ball courts (etc) in the spring / summer months.

Include a new curling facility with enough seating to qualify for provincial and national events

Include curling as part of the new facility. It should be designed to be able to be accessible to individuals with disabilities, host events like the Tankard, as well as be able to host other events (ex. Ball hockey) outside of the curling season

Include curling rink in plans

Including the proposed curling centre and childcare centre would benefit the larger Woodstock community which continues to expand. A walking track in this facility would also be beneficial for parents of kids participating in activities, allow indoor training for sports teams, and provide safe walking for seniors throughout the winter time and during hot summer weather. Please review best practices for multi-use centres in SW Ontario and visit some outside of the city. There are great centres within a 2 hour radius of Woodstock that have a central reception area with swimming, hockey, and indoor sports halls. Depending on the sporting needs assessment - curling or hockey ice surfaces can be used "off season" for additional sporting activities, summer camps or potentially wedding or other rental income. Anticipated costs will continue to rise for this facility - let's borrow the money and get it done. Investing in a high level facility will benefit youth, adults and seniors to stay active and healthy, will provide opportunities for various sporting organizations to host regional, provincial or even national level competitions - sports tourism brings revenue to the city - both through facility rentals and also through local hotel and restaurant spending.

Incorporate a new curling facility into the complex. The current curling club's facility is old and it has maxed out its cabability with private membership carrying the costs of the current facility. It could benefit with help of the city owning the building and sharing the cooling system for the hockey arenas to maintain the ice of the curling club.

Indoor track for arena as well as outdoor track somewhere in city that I won't break my ankle on

Ingersoll Pool used to do Flick-n-dip on fridays for kids to watch a movie and then do open swim - we should offer more programs like this for our youth.

Investing in a facility can accommodate large tournaments brings revenue back into the community. These facilities are also able to be used for future community events.

Investment into other sports and rec activities should be considered as well; the curling club is old, waterslides for the new pool or outdoor pad, a running track, etc.

Is there community involvement in funding opportunities such as fundraising?

It does not need to be a palace! Functional and intelligent design to get the most out of each dollar. Woodstock already has a premier 'top end' facility to meet tournament needs.

It does seem like the boys hockey teams spent most of their games and practises at the Reeves complex & the girls are out of the civic more. Building a new twin pad would offer a better facility, with more ice time available for both associations and provide more opportunities for girls hockey to share two facilities with the boys hockeys teams, so the girls aren't in the older Civic facility. I do not live in Woodstock, but majority of our time & sports are spent in Woodstock and listen to Woodstock residents about the same opinions as mine in this survey.

It feels as though this Council is actively over spending at a time when the economy is in dire straits. Citizens have already seen huge tax hikes and everything is becoming difficult to afford. This seems like a low priority, high cost venture. An astronomical amount of money goes toward homeless cleanup and services, leaving less money for important local services. We should focus on repairing what we have, such as Lions Pool, maintaining our current recreational facilities, and ensuring we have necessary funds for critical projects. Respect the tax payers' money.

It is a long over due project that is needed to service the community. Arenas and a pool are top priority.

It is a must with this overpopulated city the amenity need to keep up. Gets kids doing healthy lifestyles instead of creating a bigger problem.

It is important to me and my family to have an outdoor pool.

It is important to stay/shop/play local and is difficult to do with no local outdoor pool.

It is long overdue. Our community needs a facility that provides an eviroment for all to come enjoy sports & recreation, a library, meeting/study rooms for students and a walking track FREE for the public. We need to promote a healthy active lifestyle for everyone, and it's time for an upgrade.

It needs to be accessible for everyone with extended hours and staff to handle the population. A child minding option would be great for parents participating in activities as well.

It needs to be built ASAP. With girls hockey growing at the rate it is and neighbouring communities not cooperating for ice time Woodstock needs to come out on top and answer the public's need for more ice. Otherwise people will go elsewhere and hockey will die out in place of other sports.

It needs to meet the needs of all ages. Facilities should be flexible to enable switching programming easily. It should be located so that no one has a long bus ride. Even though I no longer have young children, it would be great if child care was available and if there was programming available for children similar to what the Y used to provide on Friday evenings. A second smaller pool that is used for young children's swimming lessons - like the warm water pool at Wayne Gretzky Centre - would be nice.

It should include a curling facility as the present one needs an update and functional improvement.

It will never be cheaper than now to build a facility.

It would be great to have a new curling facility available in the city

It would be great to have a space to serve for martial arts/ boxing / jiu jitsu

It would be nice to have an indoor swimming pool vs outdoor so that we can use throughout the year.

It would be nice to see a public indoor play area for kids. Like park equipment to use during winter months or when it is raining outside

Just build it all ready. We are all tried of hearing it's coming. We desperately are in need of it.

Look at the experience of other municipalities closely esp. where they compromised elements for budget reasons vs those that didn't and the overall outcomes of those decisions (wish we had...).

Look to include a gym/fitness area

Make a facility with gyms with other health amenities (sauna, cold plunge, squash courts, weight room, track and pool) at an affordable rate that is better than current private fitness facilities. Honestly you should probably address the homeless problem and address where our tax money goes instead of building another facility. Why do we pay high taxes and we pay for garbage and need to shovel the side walk? This is the only city I've lived that is like this.

Make a place for kids and teams to come together, a place to represent our community to promote healthy active living for families. Girls hockey is becoming larger in Ontario and it's so amazing to empower more girls to come out and play! Building a recreation centre is essential for those in the community, it's where people come together and the people of Woodstock deserve a place like this! If things continue to delay or making the community wait, there's not enough space for swimming spots, not enough ice time people will start going to other city centres to accommodate there needs which in turn doesn't bring a community together, and makes the associations like the Woodstock wildcats less desirable.

Make it for everyone, not just competitive teams and sports

Make it functional and accessible (physically for people but also financially) there is no point in cheaping out and cutting corners. Have a kitchen space

Make it happen asap

Make it work

Make sports affordable for families. Raising fees and then giving less ice time is not ok. Prioritize our ice time, Stop renting it out to these hockey development guys who are charging families over \$500 for a week of development when the people who pay hockey fees could use the ice time for practices.

Make sure it's affordable for everyone, not just for the rich....this would explain why so many of us go out of town.

Make sure the showers are all clean

Make sure there is lots of parking, maybe two pools in the building on one side and then other events on the other side of the building. Like a gym/ gymnastics / etc

Make sure there is room to expand in the future. If you don't build a pool right away, make sure the design is ready so it can be added later

Make sure we do it right, don't cut corners to save a dime.

Make sure you build a new pool. Make it a large pool. You can never full use Southside pool due to overcrowding.

Make sure you have people designing that have children/ youth in the current sports and have experienced what a good facility should include.

Make use of existing outdoor city space for outdoor rinks and skate trails to get ppl outside enjoying physical activity. Much cheaper & could be provided much quicker than building indoor facilities. Look for volunteers to flood & maintain spaces & businesses sponsors to fund it.

Many people advocating for a new facility do not live in Woodstock and do not pay taxes to the city of Woodstock. They should be responsible for some of the cost as well.

Maybe let people know more about your plan, I don't know what you have in mind but I haven't seen any information about it aside from this survey. Is it going to be exactly like the other rec centres or is it completely different? You should do more publicity of events once it's up and also for your other centres currently. Honestly I've lived in Woodstock for 3 years now and didn't know any Rec centres existed aside from Cowan and we've never gone there even. No reason to. Cowan appears to be nothing but an indoor open field. I'd rather a venue for events like comedians and presenters than a rec centre.

Most citizens are frustrated by the city's constant useless prioritization of the downtown core. Everyone is afraid to go there because of the drugs and homeless situations. Not particularly about the facility however, spell checking your survey is a suggestion. "At lease..." is not correct! As well I would suggest adding an option of "multiple uses per week" as most families who have children in sports use facilities upwards of 3-4 times per week which cannot be represented accurately in your survey. This would show a significant need for the new facility.

Now's the time Get the right people in to make sure it is properly built versus other new arenas/pools that have many flaws that could have been caught with the right design company.

Offer city amenity memberships. (Access to pools, track, pickleball etc). Consider a satellite library facility, plan for future city growth in new facility.

Offering a higher end facility with more amenities will not only service the community better, but it will also bring in people from other areas as well for use (tournaments, meets, rentals from the smaller cities around Woodstock) which will bring additional revenue to the city. In other cities I've seen them with gymnasiums, gyms (fitness), community rooms for rentals that are usually busy evenings and weekends and that can be used 12 months a year that again is a steady stream of rental fees.

Other cities have built incredible facilities with so many great options for its citizens and to host events and tournaments. Fingers crossed that woodstock gets it right

Our city has a rapidly growing population. Restoring and improving the YMCA, adding a new rec center would provide two new pools plus programming for the city. It is so important for families to be active together. Additionally, the southside splash pad should reopen and just charge a 3.00 fee per person to get in.

Our city is growing very rapidly. We cannot wait until we have all funding. I already fear that by the time we get this new facility built, that we will already be approaching capacity again and be looking for the next project. Service rates are spendy and often the BAS techs have little knowledge of the HVAC equipment. They work in a binary world. Ones and zeros. It is a real treat to work with them when they do not understand. Often those companies have the base coding written offshore which presents challenges. Commissioning of buildings is often poorly executed. Commissioning should be the most thorough part, monitoring the entire process and onsite for a start-ups of Currently at a new hospital and inside of two years of opening the heating plant has failed and equipment. chiller has failed. Both are the result of poor design and lack of detailed commissioning. A new functional hospital has a temporary heating plant in the loading dock. Chiller is torn apart for major repairs due to improper selection on the cooling tower. Yes, Woodstock needs another facility. Not against it. Please take time and consider the cost of a new facility and timelines. Do not rush a project of this size. I have the ability to pay my mortgage due to rushed jobs. I sound cynical but I live in the industry and have had the pleasure of good and bad jobs.

Price out the possibility of an indoor/outdoor pool... sliding doors that can open for summer swimming. My autistic kids can't handle indoor pools because the echoing, but even a few sliding doors would alleviate some of that noise. Possibility for an outdoor skating rink that has infrastructure for ice maintenance (Waterloo has one like this)... and time for non-hockey skating. Pickleball courts? Would be great to have some this end of the city.

Prioritize keeping youth AND middle aged folks active. Difficult to find adult rec programs. Difficult to find teen spaces.

Prioritize seating if a new twin pad is indeed constructed, nothing worse than playing on a pad with no seating (this from a parent of a Woodstock program)

Prioritizing millions of dollars in the downtown core is a huge mistake when the city has such a need for additional recreational facilities. This is long overdue

Provide bus service if it already doesn't have it. Its too far to walk to for a lot of residents I use the faculties more than once a week. Why is this not included. Once a week does not justify a new facility

Put in a pool

Question 10 should be modified to explain what the difference is between a facility that meets community needs and a facility to run a tournament. Either way, tournaments bring people to spend in the economy and local businesses

Question 8 needs to be a little less ambiguous. It is the expectation that the amount of taxes paid by local citizens should be used effectively. There are not nearly enough amenities in Woodstock that can validate the taxes that are paid. As the city approved population and housing increases the local amenities did not increase. Questions 10 is also a bit tricky to answer. I believe that we need a top tier facility in order to limit continuous improvement costs. Build something that would be still viable 25 years from now. Overall the costs should be lower doing it in one step rather than perpetual additions and retrofits.

Re #10: if we have a tournament level facility, we need more hotels.

Re open Lions Pool

Reach out to users as to what comparable rinks are good. Ideally a twin pad rink with an indoor pool and maybe a room that can be rented for birthday parties might be popular.

Realistically we need more than 2 pads of ice, but whatever you do, please don't put just 1 in. Woodstock has grown so much that it is difficult to apply for competitions because of lack of ice availability.

Really focus on functionality versus aesthetics.

Select level teams are forced to practice at arenas in other towns and wildcats teams are also forced to drive to other towns or miss out on adequate practice time. Shutting down the southside wading pool was a dumb decision.

Since the YMCA pool has closed, a second indoor pool in Woodstock is greatly missed.

Since we are the worst region for childcare options, it would be wise to build one within the building. We are a growing community and will only need more childcare options. Please consider other amenities for the pool portion such as warmer wading pool for accessibility needs and young ones, hot tub for seniors, sauna, and full competition length pool for future competitions.

Small communities also rely on Woodstock facilities, those numbers need to be accounted for (ie. no pool or girls hockey in Embro, Hickson, Sweaburg, etc).

So further to question 10. I would be concerned about spending north of 50 million dollars on a bare minimum arena facility when we consider the timeline lining up with the Reeves Community Complex starting to age. So I would want to be sure through state of good repair and future planning that the Community Complex can meet the needs of the city as the premier facility. Another issue I don't see addressed in this questionaire is the fact that despite current spikes in ice use locally hockey registration is on the decline nation wide. I would hate to put 50 million recreation dollars into a very niche basket when facilities like the gyms, pools and outdoor rec facilities can be used by a much broader range of citizens. Maybe we should take a hard look at modernizing the Civic Center arena before we have another Lion's Pool situation on our hands.

So many local hockey associations can't get local ice time in Woodstock and are forced to look elsewhere or just not form teams leaving kids not playing. Finding out actual ice needs compared to what we have currently would be a start

Some kind of bar / restaurant would be nice to make extra money for the facility

The city is growing at a rate that we need to accelerate infrastructure. The north west end of Woodstock could use some amenities ie shopping, grocery stores etc. Plan and execute a new recreation facility asap so the current kids can enjoy it.

The city is growing you need to keep up

The city is in real need of another pool. Only one is not adequate for our growing city especially since the lions pool has been closed

The city of Woodstock has enough revenue stream to support a new facility. If it doesn't maybe consider changing bylaw codes to allow for high rises which will allott more tax funds

The City should develop a proper recreation board to oversee the facilities design and construction, not only should the board members have athletic experience but also construction knowledge and experience.

The civic center arena is simply a facility to serve the needs. We desperately need a twin pad. We are renting ice outside the city. That speaks volumes.

The civic centre has the best ice around!! But the arena is old and failing. It's not able to facilitate what Woodstock needs. The Woodstock Wildcats use this arena on the daily, the change rooms are old and small, it's not accessible which should be very important to the city. I think by building a new facility everyone could benefit from it. Twin pads, pool, rentable hall for functions, the friendly city needs to meet the demands of a growing city and build a new facility for its expanding population.

The community can benefit financially from the ability to host high demand tournaments. We're central in southern Ontario which makes us a high demand area. Additionally we're under utilizing our senior hockey potential (further revenue generating) because there simply isn't enough ice with the minor hockey needs. It's been impossible to book ice for years as an adult so people stop trying but the need is there as well.

The community is growing and the number of facilities has not increased to keep up. In some cases the number of facilities have decreased, for example we had 3 pools (lions, southside, ymca) and now we have 1.

The community is only growing larger. We need to be able to accommodate it

The community needs a multipurpose recreational facility. An indoor pool, two ice rinks with viewing areas, gym, and multipurpose rooms

The cost of the downtown improvements are excessive and the not all the changes make sense for the community. Downsize those plans and divert some of the funds to a rec center

The council needs to take into consideration that our population is growing quickly and our current facilities are not going to hold up much longer

The current facilities at cowan field are great, except, the covered area is always occupied by residents of the area and not people using the facilities. Even asking teams who are participating to leave "their area". More shaded areas are needed

The current facility can already host tournaments and therefore you dont need another to do the same thing, just get more ice time available so the kids dont have to leave Woodstock to play elsewhere.

The entrance to the new centre should not be through Springbank. There are already enough people speed through the residential area. Putting an entrance at the end of Springbank will make it worse.

The facility is desperately needed

The longer this waits to begin construction the more costs increase. If we have to fund it through borrowing, at least the interest paid is paid while being used. The increased construction costs with delays do nothing more

than increase taxes.

The longer you wait the more money will be

The money being wasted on the downtown streetscape is a disgrace and would much better serve the community being put towards a rec complex. Planning for the rec complex along with starting a rec complex reserve fund should have started years ago and construction should be commencing now. Stop putting bandaids on old rec facilities and build for the future.

The more active we stay as we age, the less demand on our health services.

The more amenities that can function under one roof, like pool, gymnasium, two ice pads, restaurant, library The more external rentals the faster it's paid off and more money into out community

The need for a new multipurpose recreation center in Woodstock is becoming increasingly urgent. As a growing city, Woodstock is seeing a demographic shift, with fewer retirement-age residents and more young families moving in. These families are seeking amenities that support their active lifestyles, providing spaces for fitness, socializing, and engaging in various recreational activities. Without a modern, multipurpose facility, the city risks losing the opportunity to fully cater to this rising demand, which could have long-term consequences for the community.

The need for more ice time is dire. Kids are having to travel to thamesford, embryo, plattsville and more to practice with their Woodstock hockey team. Woodstock is the large centre for all surrounding small towns and barely has enough amenities to support the people living within the city.

The need is there. You will be able to get more people in the door to pay any loans back quickly. We are a central location so tournaments would also draw lots of funds from out of town teams. Living just outside of the city I appreciate a closer facility.

The new facility should include a new Curling Centre. Curling's popularity is on the rise and the existing Curling Centre is outdated and this gives the opportunity to build an inclusive venue.

The offerings we have in the city are good, we have just run out of space to service the community properly The pool should be modelled after the Wilmot Rec Centre pool. It is hands down the best pool for family swimming. I do not use the Woodstock pool because it is not family friendly.

The price will only continue to rise if you wait to build it.

The proposal to have only one ice pad is ridiculous. Build two or build none, one is not going to solve the significant ice shortage. As for a pool, I hope they are considering an outdoor pool also

The rec programs Woodstock runs are some of the best in the province. We need the facilities to keep up with the talent that is being brought in by the programs. I believe ice time is one of the biggest needs at this time and the city is in need of 4 functional pads to allow talent to stay in Woodstock. A pool would be a close second as it is nearly impossible to get siblings into similar swimming lesson times at a reasonable time during the school year.

The report recommends collaborations, strength in partnerships, subject matter expertise access etc. partnerships should be given strong consideration. Positioning or language regarding YMCA sustainability issues province wide is a generalization, as the majority of YMCA's across the province and nation are sustainable and have healthy balance sheets; and have a positive charitable impact in the community it serves. The pool is likely not operational at the Woodstock YMCA due to AN unwillingness the city has to partner and support an asset like the YMCA who deliver programs like aquatics. There many positive YMCA/Municipal facility/service delivery models across the country that you might want to inquire about.

The return on investment in a state of the art facility would show up in tourism and economy. It would help our local businesses thrive and for Woodstock to grow as a destination for tournaments, leisure. It will pay itself off

The sooner its built the cheaper in the long run. The price keeps rising every year you keep holding off. Just like the other 2 diamonds that were never built at Cowan fields. You could have mostly games played there and not have to travel all over the city to play and open up the concession stand at a reasonable price so people can buy something there. If you had more diamonds you could have more higher end tournaments meaning more money to the city.

The sooner the better

The sooner the better, we are quickly growing out of the facilities we have. I would love to see a walking track

in the arena as well. We have travelled to many arenas in Ontario and having seating at the venue is a must (not metal bleachers like the green pad at the complex)

The sooner the better.

The Southside pool was built a very long time ago and suited the population. Woodstock has grown substantially and nothing has been done to meet the needs of pool people. Just try to register a child for swim lessons after the first registration day. That shows how great the need is. Not to beautify a block a year downtown. Get your heads out of the clouds

The splash pad at south side never should have been closed it was a staple for young kids.

The struggles my family has is ice times. Not enough swimming lesson time slots, daycare waitlists

The user fees associated with the new recreation facility will determine whether my family can take advantage of activities. I am concerned about paying via tax dollars for facilities that I may not be able to afford due to user fees. Municipal recreation has never been profitable and that's not the point of it. I dislike the idea that I might contribute via today's tax levy for a facility that won't be completed until my family ages out of its use. I will be especially irritated if the construction creates noise/mess/traffic closures in our current north-end neighbourhood, followed by increased traffic through our street and obstructive street parking by facility patrons in the future. If we're going to build it, then let's do it now and do it properly: ensure that parking and change rooms are sufficiently ample to improve the choices for our current local youth, and protect the condition of the surrounding family neighbourhood.

The Woodstock Curling Center is very old and VERY popular. There are so many benefits of curling and also the social aspect associated with the center. Curling is good for ALL players, regardless of age, gender, physical limitations, etc. It is a super healthy outlet and it is the most social sport I can think of (even more than golf!). A new curling facility would be the absolute best and would benefit so many people! We already have almost 300 members so imagine a new facility and more members?!? It would be incredible. I dont live in Woodstock but I commute there everyday and my husband and I work there.

The Woodstock wildcats girls hockey association deserves a center that is up to date, nice and inviting to opposing teams. There are much smaller centers with much nicer and larger home arenas

There are 50,000 new residents in the city. How is there not enough money from Taxes to build an adequate sports facility to accommodate the growing city and the children and families and people that live in it

There are a lot of young children and not enough facilities to accommodate please expedite this process before the kids are all grown up

There are many great examples of nice arenas in southern Ontario (Gale Centre, Atlas Tube Centre, Gretzky Centre, etc.) that could be used to determine the right design. Also, corporate investors should be sought to help cover the cost.

There are much more important things to worry about. Our taxes are high enough. How bout you work with what we already have (it is not broken?!) And find a way to lower taxes to make woodstock affordable. My taxes are almost \$3000 and I don't even have a back yard! I can't put a fence up on my corner lot because of bylaws. We also have to pay for bag tags. Shouldn't garbage removal be included in our taxes? This grand plan is a waste of tax dollars

There are so many organizations that would love to expand or have already expanded but not enough time alloted to them to be able to schedule enough affective practices for skill development and team building. With more space, and availability, opens more development, expansion of organizations, and possibly room for new sports/activities and events to be held which will bring more people to the City and support our local businesses

There currently is not enough available ice to meet the needs of the youth hockey teams (boys and girls) as it is. In addition to this, Civic is becoming run down. The changeroom walls are literally crumbling. Great look for the arena the girls are relegated to!

There have been many similar facilities built over the last several years that have been able to include, community rooms, double ice pads, fitness facilities, aquatic center and even Libraries. They've also had snack bars and some have had pubs as well. Hopefully a facility that serves the community and can be considered a tournament ready can be developed. This could bring alot of tourism funds into town and allow more people to use local facilities instead of traveling.

There is a huge need for a facility like this in Woodstock. Our current facilities are either dated or don't have the capacity to maintain demands on their various sporting requirements. If the City combined all of these new amenities into a single complex and then sold off the other aging assets they would be able to create some capital to help fund the build. I manage a construction company here in Woodstock and can inform you that time will only cause the budgeted figure to increase. This is of course a large decision and investment for the City and can appreciate the due diligence taken. Woodstock is a growing community and business hub and this would only help increase that. Other businesses like hotels and restaurants would also likely be drawn to that end of town as a result.

There is not enough pool space in the city. Especially with the closure of Lions Pool, there should be "extra" pool space built to make up for this.

There is not one place in Woodstock that allows roller skating indoors. It's not an expensive activity to allow, and is no where near as hard on floors as perceived. I'd bet floor hockey is harder on floors. I travel to Waterloo, Guelph and London often just for indoor roller skating.

There is still ample availability at our current rec centers. There is no need to build a new one. This is a want, not a need. City staff should be directed to focus on cost savings in all departments, not new ways to spend more money.

There isn't enough ice times for the existing hockey teams— we have to go to Embro, Thamesford and other areas

There needs to a dedicated bus route to this new facility every day of the week, including Sunday.

There seems to be a lot of talk and no actions. Money is set aside one year for facility and improvements, and the next it is removed by the incoming council it would seem that we're in a hamster cage in which the community is not seen any benefit except for seeing funds being spent on surveys consultations, etc. There should be a second library added to this facility.

There should be stuff for kids outside like a bike trac or skatepark, gardens, outdoor pool, outdoor rink, playgrounds, a remote control boat pond, stocked fishing pond, stuff to keep kids busy outdoors.

These large capital investments are challenging to prioritize. Is there private corporate money in Woodstock or Oxford County that can be solicited e.g. Toyota, Sysco, some of the trucking companies. Input of dollars from several corporations (along with naming rights) may speed along the feasibility of actually getting the facility built.

These questions are a bit pointedbut in terms of hockey and ice. The Reeves complex is great for tournaments, another basic arena (or upgraded civic center(with another rinn or two, that would be good for practices that wouldn't get canceled to fulfill tournament needs)

They have know for years that the city would need a new pool ...Lions is gone, Southside too small and aging Build Olympics indoor size pool(city is growing, all children should learn to swim, and have the opportunity to develop skills to become world class swimming athletes. This should be more than a hockey and baseball city. The land is there, bite the bullet Council build big indoor pool. Follow Cambridge Ont plan.... Build Now ...Invest now ...for the future it won't get cheaper so do it NOW

Things like swimming lessons should be AFFORDABLE for all classes, various income levels. Providing the opportunity for children to be active, have mentors and learn new skills and meet new people should be something that everyone in our community should be able to take advantage of. Swimming lessons, skating, soccer etc. Figure out more way to earn or generate income but give children the OPPORTUNITY.

Think about accessibility for all types of people. Quiet times. Easy entrance. Parking. And programs that would benefit a diverse community.

Think beyond sports! Recreation can mean more than that. Think gathering places that are safe, functional and usable for all sizes. Think year-round functionality to allow people to get out in the winter months. Make spaces that people can book (at reasonable prices) for events/markets/ hockey parties/ board meetings/birthdays. Maybe think about space outside for a skating rink in the winter. We'll curated outdoor garden space with places for eating and relaxing in the shade while you wait for someone taking a class inside.

Think bigger this city is going to be built quickly and we need to preplan so our city can take on more people Think of a recreational facility has a preventative for health issues which will help with our health care issue This city is in dire need of an outdoor pool facility. We keep putting bandages on outdated facilities. It's time to

bite the bullet and build new facilities to support the growth of the city. We need more readily available recreational activities.

This decision is long past due for residents

This facility should be for the people in the city who are paying for it. Our fields that aren't meant for tournaments suck. I'd love to see our money going to our community.

This facility should have been planned years ago and should have been completed....not waiting until Lions Pool is closed and Southside Pool requires major repairs to continue to operate.

This is a prime location for tournament, right off the highway. Lots of parking and a food option would be great as there isn't much out that way.

This is a very important community need. If funding was already present my responses would be very different. I would love for this to be prioritized and built immediately, but not at the expense of future generations paying the price for the high levels of debt and interest payments. The most recent capital plan for the City of Woodstock is ahocking. For anyone with good financial literacy skills, it is becoming obvious this friendly city is in trouble financially and we already have very high property taxes in relation to the rest of the province. If citizens are expected to be fiscally responsible in their own household it needs to be modelled to them by cities, municipalities and governments how to do this.

This is a want not a need. We need to focus on more important things like getting rid of these homeless people and the methadone clinics and throwing them in jail. Focus on Healthcare, and schooling. We already have recreation facilities. We don't need more.

This is an investment in the community that can generate income for the local economy but boosting recreation program offerings, hosting more tournaments and events and providing childcare for young families who work in necessary services.

This is an opportunity for Oxford to be a leader for recreational sports in the region. It will attract well needed tourism dollars to the county and promote good health and wellness for our youth and adults alike. The pool is critical for this building! Learning to swim is a life saving critical skill!

This is long overdue, for the amount we pay in property taxes we deserve much more from this city. Families need indoor activities, especially in the winter.

This is something that has been promised and talked about for years- in order to have a vibrate and flourishing Woodstock/Oxford county we need action now. These types of facilities help build community in so many ways- jobs, family time, kids in positive activities etc

This lack of ice time is such a disappointment and shame! especially since there is such a need and this issue has been around for a while and it seems like not enough is being done at the top end. The hockey organization seems dismissive of people's opinions and only seems to have a certain agenda. Prioritzing our youth sports not outside groups and old timers. Invest in ALL youth teams and activities!

This needs to be built as soon as possible. Other smaller communities who have not had the exponential growth Woodstock has, have much nicer, user friendly facilities. I've lived in Woodstock since 1981 and very little upgrades have been made since then.

This needs to be done now the amount of revenue and tourists would increase Woodstock needs to support its population needs and be affordable for multi children families

This needs to happen now. Minor hockey is already doing a disservice to youth by eliminating travel teams due to lack of ice, they are driving people out of the city.

This new facility seems expensive, unwarranted, out of the way, and not well thought out. Pickleball is a fad do we really need 8 courts? Revamping Lion's Pool would have been a much more satisfactory solution as the main thing lacking is outdoor swim facilities. The reasons against Lion's Pool such as parking were very weak is it not eco-friendly to have a facility you can walk or bike to without much parking? We may be headed into a recession do we really want to bite off \$85 million? It is disappointing to see council express such fiscal irresponsibility especially when members acted like \$2 million for Lion's Pool was such a big amount to borrow. Disappointed.

This recreation centre is so desperately needed now!!! I have watched Woodstock grow over the last 10 years. It was once a quaint place but has now become so crowded, making things inaccessible. I want to know that I will be able to access the services available in my community. There are so few spaces available for activities

within the city, making it hard for everyone to have the opportunity to participate and be engaged in the community.

This should have been started 10 years ago, why does everything need to be in one building your never going to use ice pads at same time as pool, most people don't put their kids in multiple activities the same day This should have been started years ago. Quit dragging your feet. Seems to be tons of money for the "downtown" and meth clinics. Put the money to more ice for the children instead of BS for drug addicts.

This town lacks severely in prioritizing children and youth Less about the homeless and drug addicts and more about the actual tax payers and their families

-this was needed 10 years ago Why have funds not been put aside already?

This would bring money into our community if we had the facilities to provide a space for international tournaments equivalently to the ones woodstock teams are currently competing in.

Though a larger upfront cost is required to build the entire facility at once, it is a lower cost overall opposed to adding onto an existing facility at a later date. And would mean less impacts to service in the future, as an addition/ renovation would have degree of service impacts.

Visit other centers that have successfully built new twin pad facilities. Belle River specifically. Witness how tournaments and large crowds are received during these events. Taking design ideas from these successfully facilities and implement them in Woodstock.

Waiting is done, time for action is now. Ridiculous to have waited this long. Way behind the eight ball.

Walking tracks and bar areas in the arena should be considered- much like the Gretzky centre in Brantford.

We are absolutely DESPERATE for more ice time for a 30km radius within Oxford county. New arenas will help alleviate the extreme need for minor hockey ice time, and would allow for Woodstock to host more tournaments and increase revenue.

We are in desperate need of a twin pad arena with a walking track.

We are in extreme need of more ice time for the city. This should've been built 5 years ago to keep up with demand. Build the twin pad and then add on to it.

We are lacking in services. We don't have enough ice or courts

We are not currently living in Woodstock but our family plays all of our sports here & are considering moving to

We are taking away and outgrowing faster than we can replace these services. Out taxes have always been high but we used to feel that we got a lot from the city for them. We are not feeling that way anymore and are reaching outside of our city for these services.

We can't keep waiting for this to be built, it's been way too long already and they can't cheap out on it either We could use a guad or tri pad

We could use another curling pad. While the current one has history and it's nice to have facilities in the core area, it is a growing sport. All pads at the curling rink are used every night during the season, as well as tournaments/bonspiels and high school games. It would be nice to have a 2nd curling rink.

We do not live in Woodstock however, have a daughter playing Wildcat hockey. Use the trails and choose Woodstock for our swimming lessons.

We don't want it. Why would we want to build a facility that meets "tournament needs at a higher cost"? Our wallets are fatigued. This has to stop. It feels very shady. People are not happy. There are 40k+ people in this town and less than 1000 will fill this out. Look at what us residents are paying a year. If you can't build a facility (and hire all the staff) out of what you have please do not go forward unless you cancel one of the other projects.

We drive to Brantford for the hydrotherapy pool and terrible if we have to go out of town to. Access this facility We have many private clubs- badminton, hockey schools, baseball skill development centers... there is a driving need for physical development and activities, at all age ranges, that is accessible to all residents.

We have put off building a new facility long enough . When we travel to many communities around us to use their facilities they are much newer with all the amenities. We are taking opportunities away from our youth to participate in travel hockey / swimming and gymnastics by not having enough facilities to accommodate the numbers wanting to participate. Our taxes go up every year and we are left with nothing to show for it ...

We have so many young families in our community looking for ways to keep our children healthy, happy and engaged I. Physical activity. Now more than ever we need a new facility, the cost of not having one is greater than the cost of the building.

We have the same amount of ice time now as we did in 1999. We used to have 3 pools in town and we now have 1.... Yet the city has grown to twice the size. How is this possible? Design a free walking track. The hours of the new facility is important. Cowan doesn't have great hours especially in the summer.

We have waited long enough for a new facility in this city. Build it already please!

We hope the city will include gym space that is multi purpose for basketball, volleyball and the like for those families who are not hockey families. The existing facility has 1 gym with an inappropriate floor for these sports and is difficult to book. School space is also harder and harder to acquire bc of our growing community as well as growing youth sports programs. Our children deserve to have space to be active and form healthy habits and we should have the time and space to continue that as well in adulthood.

We just need it sooner than later

We just need something that is used equally between all leagues in the town. A place where it's not embarrassing bringing people into play against our team.

We live off of the 401 and the 403; this project should've happened years ago. It will tremendously help the city and tournaments will fill those new hotels. Please fix the Civic afterwards to keep that arena open as well. It's well needed in this city.

We love the trail system. Keep up the good work here!

We NEED a pool.

We need a good pool. Please visit other communities to see what works and doesn't work

We need a new Curling facility

We need a new facility because WMHA is turning away teams due to lack of ice team.

We need a new pool, we have many ice rinks for one one very old gross pool facility

We need a new swimming pool

We need a rec center that has a free walking track!

We need another dual-pad arena. And another pool - both indoor and outdoor would be nice. The city has

grown but our swimming and skating facilities have not been improved upon in many many years. Larger change rooms would also be nice - several smaller centres have great facilities we could model from - Wilmot, Ayr, Wellesley, Fergus. .. to name a few

We need another pool!!!!!!!

We need another pool, outdoor would be great! Also, would love a new curling facility.

We need equitable ice time for GIRLS hockey!!

We need ice very badly, girls hockey is so popular and the city is only getting bigger

We need ice!!!

We need ice. We are also a central hub in location. We would be an excellent place to host big tournaments that would bring tourism and people to Woodstock.

We need indoor basketball and volleyball courts that aren't in schools. New indoor pool. Southside is too busy. We need more activities in this town to keep kids away from the homeless and drugs issues this town has! Since we can't seem to deal with the homeless people that are stealing, using drugs on our front yards then a place farther away with more for the kids will be better than them having nothing to do.

We need more and we need it now! But I do not believe this facility needs to meet tournament or other needs, it needs to cater to our people and their want for actitities! We need a public skate on Saturday during the day and a place for kids to swim indoors in the winter and not be stomped on my other people swimming! We need more ice in Woodstock for hockey. A twin pad is essential.

We need more ice time. New arena just needs to be a simple two pad arena with a common warm area to access both rinks. There are lots of nice arenas around that the council should visit to get ideas from We need more indoor pools.

We need more than 2 indoor pools. We need an outdoor pool too!

We need more things to do for all ages to help keep us more active and it be affordable to all incomes We need more to accommodate the growing community.

WE NEED ONE ASAP. The entire community needs this. Please stop tabling these plans for more downtown revitalization. Our kids are not playing downtown and with the state of it we don't want them to be.

We need pools, not arenas. Start hosting swim meets in Woodstock. Parking was never an issue at lions pool. Stop making excuses

We need the arenas now. The civic needs to be closed down and there is no ice time available during peak times. The civic is also in desperate need of repairs and updating that simply is not worth the price tag. I don't live in Woodstock but I am from Innerkip and I use the facilities all the time. I volunteer my time and coach two teams on minor hockey and I would love to see this get pushed through. Additional suggestions for a new arena would be making use of natural light as much as possible and having a bar/restaurant between the rinks like many of the modern facilities you see being built now.

We need this !

We need to get ahead of a community that is busting at the seams and continuing to grow. Delaying a project will only cost the taxpayers more money in the long run. Include all options As proposed in the concept drawings.

We need to take money out of the reserves and consider going into debt to pay this off over time. Do not plan to add on - we need to keep our kids in sports. Teams are being cut because there are no facilities. Our pool is

always packed.
